Fun for the Whole Family!



West Bradford Township is Proud to be ~~Cheap~~... Frugal!

Several years ago the Township received a \$165,000 state grant to purchase a recycling collection truck. At the end of the vehicle's useful life the Township sold this truck for \$30,000.

Often, such proceeds are required to be returned to the Commonwealth. But officials from West Bradford and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection worked together to dedicate these dollars for additional improvements to the Township's recycling program. In June the Township used a portion of these funds to buy a compost turner via an on-line auction site. The equipment had been purchased by the Boston Public Works Department in 2001, and was sitting idle in a garage just a few miles from Fenway Park. The Township paid less than \$11,000 for the compost turner, which retails for about \$90,000.

The engine on the 10-year old compost turner had run for a total of two hours... that's like buying a used car with 500 miles on the odometer! After a quick oil change and some new paint, the equipment was placed in service at the West Bradford Compost Site, where it has dramatically increased the Township's ability to process yard waste. The balance of funds will be used to make additional improvements to the Township recycling program in the coming months. Equipment and improvements worth approximately \$275,000 – and all without Township tax dollars!

38th Annual Marshalton Triathlon – October 2nd

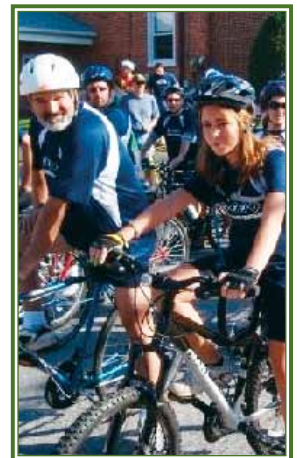

Flush with Care: Help Protect Our Sewage Grinder Pumps

SEWAGE GRINDER PUMPS ARE A CRITICAL COMPONENT in the Township's wastewater treatment system. The pumps, which are in operation at dozens of properties throughout West Bradford, help to properly convey wastewater to the treatment plant for processing.



All varieties of baby wipes – even “flushable” wipes – will damage your grinder pump!

While located on private property, grinder pumps are owned and maintained by West Bradford Township. A grinder pump will last many years under normal operating conditions. And when the pump requires repair or replacement due to expected wear and tear, the Township provides this service at no cost to the property owner. But under an Ordinance adopted by the Township in August, property owners who cause damage to their grinder pumps by discharging unauthorized materials into the wastewater system, or by other acts, will be required to pay for the pump's repair... a cost that can easily exceed \$3,000!

THE ONLY MATERIALS PERMITTED TO BE DISCHARGED INTO THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM ARE:

- Human waste and toilet paper
- Grey water from showers, sinks, tubs and dishwashers
- Conventional food wastes (*not including grease!*) as processed through an in-sink garbage disposal unit
- Laundry washing machine discharge

All other materials are not permitted to be discharged into the Township's sewer system, and these materials can damage or destroy your grinder pump. This includes so-called “flushable” baby wipes (All varieties of baby wipes will damage your grinder pump!), feminine products, diapers, plastics, latex and grease.

Not sure if your property has a grinder pump? If a cream-colored control box (with a red plastic light on top) is attached to the side or rear of your house, your property is serviced by a grinder pump. But if you have additional questions about grinder pumps and your property please call the Township at (610) 269-4174. The new grinder pump Ordinance may be viewed at westbradford.org.

Simple Steps to a Sustainable Life: Recycling BY: DOMINIC J. BORDA

A new, regular feature focusing on green living

Recycling is a simple step people can take to contribute to a sustainable society and environment.

WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF THE SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING PROGRAM in West Bradford Township, the separation process has been eliminated, replaced with a far less complex system that aims to increase the amount of materials recycled by Township residents.

Even though recycling is required under Pennsylvania law, it comes down to the attitudes and resolve of residents. What is more important and effective than enforcement of these rules is the encouragement and motivation provided by the Township and recycling industries. With the proper education and recycling guidelines, residents will eventually become as used to recycling materials and products as they are to disposing of them in regular trash.

The Township has produced a straightforward tactic for residents to recycle: place a list of the materials and products that

are recyclable on each recyclable toter. Similarly, households can place these lists near trash receptacles as a reminder of what should not be placed in regular municipal waste. The list can then be viewed to ensure the material discarded cannot be recycled.

This step comes at a time when the Country is becoming more “environmentally aware” and companies have begun to supply affordable technologies and products that allow consumers to be “green” at home. Residents and the Township should continue to encourage each other to provide and to utilize more efficient and comprehensive programs for product and material recovery.

**RECYCLABLES BELONG IN
RECYCLABLE TOTERS ONLY**

Township Ordinance requires that all recyclable materials be placed in recyclable toters (yellow lid) only. Recyclable materials are not allowed in refuse toters. **Electronic chips embedded in all toters allow the Township to track refuse and recyclable activities at each property, and help to identify disposal policy violations.**

**THE BELOW ITEMS MUST BE
PLACED IN RECYCLABLE TOTERS:**

- Newspapers, inserts & junk mail
- Magazines, catalogs & envelopes
- Paperback books & phone books
- Hardcover books (remove cover)
- Boxboard (i.e., cereal boxes)
- Cardboard
- Office & school paper – white & color
- Paper bags
- Paper egg cartons
- Packing paper
- Aluminum & tin cans (please rinse)
- Empty aerosol cans
- Clean aluminum foil
- Plastics #1 – #7 (rinse & remove lids, no styrofoam)
- Clear, green or brown glass jars and bottles (rinse & remove lids)

ALERT: Hazardous Materials Incident in West Bradford Township

What started as a normal recycling collection day for one Township employee quickly became a dangerous and frightening situation.



Hazardous Materials Disposal

Chester County conducts hazardous material collection days. For the schedule, please visit westbradford.org, or call (610) 269-4174.


AFTER EMPTYING A RECYCLABLE TOTER IN HIS TRUCK, the employee heard a loud pop in the truck's packer. Smoke billowed into the cab. The employee's face turned red and he had difficulty breathing. After exiting the vehicle, he saw that a substance which had spilled out of the truck and onto the roadway was now bubbling on the pavement. The employee called for help. The responding emergency personnel included the

Pennsylvania State Police, Good Fellowship Ambulance Company, Medic 91, West Bradford Fire Company and the Chester County HAZMAT Team. While the Township employee was being treated at the scene, the HAZMAT Team tested the substance, which was found to be a strong acid.

The roadway was closed for three hours, and the truck was taken out of service for decontamination for the rest of the

day. In all, 13 emergency service vehicles and 42 emergency personnel (not including Township employees) responded to this serious incident, at an approximate cost of \$5,800... which does not include any expense or loss of equipment incurred by West

Bradford Township. In

closing, please be aware of the danger and expense when hazardous materials are improperly disposed. Persons will be fined if they place hazardous materials in their refuse or recyclable toter. We thank you for helping to protect our employees and your neighbors!

**This collection is for leaves and brush only.
Grass clippings are not accepted!**

All pick-ups must be scheduled in advance by contacting the Township at (610) 269-4174 or by e-mailing Patty Murdoch at pmurdoch@westbradford.org.

Leaves must be placed in biodegradable paper leaf bags only, and the bags must be placed at the curbside no later than 6:00 am on the day of collection. Leaves placed in any other type of container will not be collected! Bags may be purchased at the Township Building, 1385 Campus Drive, Monday to Friday, from 7:00am to 4:30pm, at a cost of \$0.50 per bag.

Brush cannot be greater than four feet long, and must be less than four inches in diameter. Brush must be tied into bundles with a cotton or hemp twine. Bundles must be free of plastic, trash, and other debris so to protect the composting equipment.

The West Bradford Compost Site, 2020 West Strasburg Road, is also available for leaf and brush drop-off on Saturdays and Wednesdays from 9am to 2pm. Grass clippings are not accepted at this site.
