The Township has grown in the number of residents and businesses over those years; however, the wonderful attributes of the Township have not been lost.

We have made great strides in the way that we serve the Township with the use of the buildings on Campus Drive. Our park and recreation system includes two first class community parks, the area for a third park, many acres of preserved land, great trails, youth programs through the WBYA, park programs and the many programs of the Downingtown Area Recreational Consortium. ## BREAKING GROUND: THE MARSHALLTON STREETSCAPES PROJECT

**Work to install new concrete curbs, brick sidewalks, crossing lanes and storm water lines in the historic Village of Marshallton will be underway in June.** These improvements will completely transform the streetscape, creating a quaint and pedestrian-friendly atmosphere reminiscent of a time long past.

The project also includes a gateway feature on Strasburg Road, at the eastern approach to the Village. The gateway will mark entry to the Village while helping to slow traffic along this busy roadway.

The project is expected to be completed in seven months. The Marshallton Streetscapes Project was made possible by a \$2.1 million grant from the Pennsylvania Community Transportation Initiative Program.

## Pool and Hot Tub Regulations

The Uniform Construction Code of Pennsylvania requires barriers completely enclose all swimming pools, hot tubs and spas with water more than two feet deep. Fences are common barriers for swimming pools, and safety covers are often used as barriers for portable hot tubs. (Note: Fixed hot tubs and spas, such as those permanently mounted in a deck, are treated as pools.)

Barriers must be non-climbable, at least four feet high as measured from the outside of the fence, and at least five feet from all property lines. All exterior entrances into the pool/spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates. And all doors leading from a residence to a pool/spa area must have audible alarms. Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must possess a code-compliant barrier. Hot tub and spa safety covers must be UL approved, and must bear a label indicating compliance with "ASTM 1346-91" specifications.

Barrier codes are very detailed, and there are additional requirements not noted here. Contact Jim Lucas, West Bradford Township Codes Department, at (610) 269-4174 or at [jlucas@westbradford.org](mailto:jlucas@westbradford.org) before purchasing and installing a pool, hot tub or spa.

## School's Out... Please Slow Down for the Kids!

The Township frequently receives complaints about people driving too fast in residential neighborhoods. Many of these complaints come from residents on cul-de-sac streets. Since these streets have little through traffic, most of the offenders are neighbors. Please take the time to consider your neighbors and their children and pets. It's not worth trying to get somewhere a little bit faster if you are involved in an accident!

## Summer Yard Clean-Up

A gentle reminder for our residents... Please, no grass clippings in your toter. Township ordinance does not allow the disposal of grass clippings in your trash and recyclable toters.

RESIDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED to leave grass clippings on their lawn, as the clippings return important nutrients to the soil and support a healthier turf. This also saves the time required to stop and bag clippings.



Other yard wastes, including leaves and brush, are accepted at the West Bradford Township Compost Site at 2020 West Strasburg Road, between Lone Eagle Road and Persimmon Drive. Please note the Compost Site does not accept grass clippings. The Compost Site is open to the residents of East Bradford Township and West Bradford Township, and proof of residency (i.e., a valid Driver's License) is required. ## See... and Be Seen!

If you have trouble seeing oncoming traffic when exiting your driveway, then it is likely oncoming traffic has trouble seeing you.

TREES, BUSHES AND TALL PLANTS at your driveway entrance will cause this problem. We recommend you trim all growth that interferes with your line of sight. If hedges are used for privacy or sound barriers, please consider relocating these back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your line of sight.

Additionally, please note that it is a violation of Township regulations to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-of-way extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement.

Our Road Crew's summer mowing program removes vegetation within the

right-of-way. They also work to clear sight areas at intersections and to remove large trees at these locations. However, we urge you to review your driveway the next time you're leaving home, and to take the time needed to correct any problem caused by vegetation interfering with your sight.

And on a related front... the Board of Supervisors recently adopted an ordinance to prohibit the growth of Bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend and break (especially when covered by snow), and fall onto sidewalks and roads. The ordinance will help to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long. It's a great time to spruce-up the landscaping, and there's no better (natural) way to prevent the growth of weeds in those prized flower beds. The mulch must



be loaded, so don't forget to bring a shovel and some strong friends. The West Bradford Compost Site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9:00am to 2:00pm.

## 2011 ROAD PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS

**West Bradford Township's tentative 2011 Road Program includes repaving of the following roads: Arrowhead Trail, Autumn View Drive, Dogwood Hill Road, Fawn Lane, Glenside Road, Margaret Drive, Marian Drive, Yankee Drive and certain sections of Lone Eagle Road.**

There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours. Sections of roadway will be closed except to emergency vehicles. West Bradford Township will notify residents living on the affected roadways in advance of the work and provide a paving information sheet that gives details regarding when you will and won't be able to drive on the streets. As always, we appreciate your patience as we work to improve our roads and to keep our community a great place to live!

## “There’s a sign on my property!”

Temporary roadside signs seem to multiply during the summer months.

- It is a violation of Township ordinance to place a sign on a property without the owner’s permission.
- Many signs are not permitted on a property except where certain activities are taking place. (i.e.: “For Sale” signs)
- When enforcement action is taken a property owner may be cited for allowing the sign to remain on his property.

You may remove and discard a sign placed on your property. You may also contact the sign owner and ask that the sign be removed.

If the sign owner doesn’t comply, contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 and request enforcement action. In addition to being a nuisance, many roadside signs are a traffic hazard, as they may distract motorists and block sight lines at busy intersections.

### DID YOU KNOW [ ANSWER ]

Members of the U.R.I., or the **United Road Improvement Club**, first met at John Shofstall’s Andara Farm in 1919 with the goal of improving West Bradford roadways. This initial meeting was witnessed by a newspaper reporter who later claimed his short article about the Club would have been much longer... had he not lost his pencil while traveling the bumpy roads to the meeting!

## ON-LOT SEWAGE SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

MANY HOMES ARE SERVED by an on-lot sewage system. All systems require maintenance to protect the environment and avoid costly repairs. The most effective maintenance for on-lot sewage systems is the regular pumping of the primary treatment (septic) tank. Pumping removes solids, prevents solids from traveling to the drainfield and allows natural treatment processes to work as intended.

### What is a Septic System?

Septic systems treat and dispose of domestic household sewage through natural processes. In its most basic form, a septic system possesses a treatment tank (i.e., septic tank) and a disposal area (i.e., drainfield). Both play important roles in cleaning wastewater for discharge in an environmentally-friendly manner. The treatment tank is a large watertight box with an inlet and outlet pipe. A septic tank is the most common type of treatment tank. Wastewater flows from the home to the treatment tank through the sewer pipe. The tank treats the wastewater naturally by holding it long enough for solids and liquids to separate. The wastewater forms three layers inside the tank. Solids lighter than water (such as fats, oils and greases) float to the top forming a layer of scum. Solids heavier than water settle at the bottom of the tank, forming a layer of sludge. This leaves a middle layer of partially clarified wastewater. The layers of sludge and scum remain in the septic tank where bacteria found naturally in the wastewater continue to break the solids down. The sludge and scum that cannot be broken down are retained in the tank until the tank is pumped. Tank baffles prevent accumulated solids from leaving the tank. Any solids that escape the tank can clog the drainfield, causing premature (and expensive) failure. The layer of clarified liquid, also known as effluent, flows from the septic tank to the disposal area. A drainfield represents the most common variety of disposal area. It is in the drainfield that effluent from the septic tank trickles through the soil for final treatment and disposal.


### How does regular tank pumping help?

The sludge and scum that cannot be broken down by biological activity are retained in the tank until it is pumped. It is very important to remove these solids before they build up and prevent the adequate storage of clarified wastewater. Once this point is reached, suspended solids will pass through the tank to the drainfield, and the wastewater will not stay in the tank long enough for bacterial activity to break down the solids. Both consequences result in greater risk for groundwater contamination and premature failure of the drainfield. Since repairing or replacing a drainfield costs significantly more than regular pumping, having your tank pumped on a regular basis is a wise investment.

### How often should I have my tank pumped?

The rate at which solids accumulate varies, and is based upon such factors as the number of people living in the house, if a garbage disposal is used, and the size of the tank. But a good rule of thumb is to pump the tank at least one time every 36 months.

### What else should I consider?

All sewage pumpers in Chester County are required to be licensed by the Chester County Health Department; the Department ensures all septage is transported safely and disposed of in an environmentally sound manner. You should always ensure that your pumper is properly licensed to haul and dispose waste. A list of licensed pumpers can be viewed at the Chester County Health Department website, and a list can be obtained by contacting the Department at (610) 344-6488. There are also several things a pumper can check while he’s servicing your system to help prevent future problems. Tank baffles should be inspected and, if necessary, repaired or replaced. Ask your pumper to note the depth of your tank lid; tank lids located no more than twelve inches below the ground surface facilitate location and pumping. If your tank lid is deeper, add a riser to save extra digging.
