West Bradford Recycles

Recycling Statistics

Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the second quarter of 2016 approximately 28.3% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period the Township collected 992.70 tons of refuse and 392.12 tons of recyclables. With your help we'll reach our goal of 35% recycling!

Recycling Saves Money

28.3% West Bradford pays \$63 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. So each ton of recycles we collect saves a ton of refuse being dumped PERCENTAGE and charged to the Township. The OF REFUSE & RECYCLABLES more we recycle, the more we save! In the second quarter of 2016 the Township collected 392.12 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$24,703.56 in landfill fees. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund... helping to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!

Land Development Updates

- Marshallton Walk: A one single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville:
 A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road.

Trimbleville Dedication Sunday, September 11

Under a heavy fog on the morning of September 11, 1777, General William Howe and Lord Cornwallis, with more than 8,000 Crown Forces, detached from the British Army at Chadds Ford, marched North on the Great Valley Road and crossed the West Branch of the Brandywine Creek at Trimble's Ford in West Bradford Township. After fording the Brandywine, the British Troops turned East at Trimbleville in their strategic flanking movement on route to their engagement and victory over General Washington and his troops at Birminghham. The Battle of the Brandywine was the largest, longest and one of the bloodiest battles of the Revolutionary War.

This coming September 11, 239 years to the day, the Friends of Martin's Tavern invites everyone to join them in the unveiling of the Trimbleville historical marker, commemorating the role the hamlet of Trimbleville played, not only in the war, but in the cultural heritage of colonial America.

The program and dedication will begin at 1:00pm at 311 Broad Run Road, West Chester. Refreshments will be served. Come out and learn about this piece of history in our back yard. Also, please visit our website at martinstavern.org.

Landfill Raises Mattress Disposal Fee

Effective 8/1/16, the Chester County Solid Waste Authority raised the fee for the disposal of mattresses and box springs. The landfill now charges a \$20 fee for each mattress or box spring received. West Bradford Township will still collect these items, but residents must pay the increased fee of \$20 per item to the Township in advance of pick-up. Please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to arrange pick-up. Money Saving Idea... When delivering a new mattress, some companies will remove the old mattress at no extra charge. When purchasing a new mattress ask about this service!



Fall Curbside Leaf and Brush Collection

his fall West Bradford Township will provide curbside collection of leaves and brush on the following four dates: Wednesday, October 19, Wednesday, November 2, Wednesday, November 16 and Wednesday, December 7. There is no cost for this service, but there are a few simple rules to follow that will help us to keep this service free...

- The collection is for leaves and brush only. Grass clippings are not accepted!
- All pick-ups must be scheduled by 2pm the day before the collection date. Residents may schedule a pick-up by contacting the Township Building at (610) 269-4174, or by e-mailing pmurdoch@westbradford.org. Please specify the number of leaf bags, the number of stick bags, and the number of bundled brush piles, as different trucks are used to collect these different types of yard waste.
- Leaves must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags.
 To avoid damaging the equipment used to compost the leaves, the bags must be free of plastic, trash, sticks and all other debris.
- Do not staple or tape bags closed.

- Sticks must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags or bundled (see below), but sticks can't be mixed with leaves.
- Bundled brush must not be longer than four feet and must be tied into manageable bundles with a cotton or hemp twine. The bundles must be free of plastic, trash and other debris to protect the composting equipment. Branches thicker than four inches will not be collected.
- Bags must be placed at curbside by 6:00am on the scheduled collection days.
- Leaves placed in any other container, including trash and recyclable toters, will not be collected. This includes all varieties of "biodegradable" or "compostable" plastic bags.

Bio-degradable bags may be obtained at the Township Office, 1385 Campus Drive, at a cost of \$.50 per bag, Monday through Friday, from 7:00am to 4:30pm. Residents may also purchase bags sold at local department stores. The West Bradford Compost Site, 2020 West Strasburg Road, is also available for leaf and brush drop-off on Saturdays and Wednesdays from 9:00am to 2:00pm. Grass clippings are accepted at this site only when the "green light" is posted at westbradford.org. Just look for the traffic signal! Also... Shrubbery and tree trimmings up to eight inches in diameter or eight feet in length may be taken to the Lanchester landfill in Honey Brook for a fee. The landfill will not accept root balls, dirt or stones. Contact the landfill at (610) 273-3771 for more information.

Tips for the Safe Use of Portable Generators

uring long-term power outages many rely on portable generators for emergency power... but many generators are installed and operated incorrectly and pose a real threat to the lives of family, neighbors and utility crews working to restore service. Follow the tips below when installing and operating portable generators:

- Follow the directions supplied with the generator. Incorrect generator use can lead to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from the toxic engine exhaust, electric shock, electrocution and fire. Never use a portable generator indoors and never use a portable generator in a garage, carport, basement, crawl space or other enclosed or partially-enclosed area... even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO buildup in the home.
- Generators should be at least 20 feet away from buildings. At even 20 feet away air flow patterns may still blow carbon monoxide into homes through attic vents, windows or doors. Keep the generator away from these openings and maintain a working carbon monoxide detector inside the home.
- To avoid electrocution, keep the generator dry. Do not use in rain or wet conditions. Operate it on a dry surface under an open canopy-like structure. Make sure your hands are dry before touching the generator.
- Turn off all appliances and lights before you begin operating the generator.

- Once the generator is running, turn appliances and lights on one at a time to avoid overloading the unit. And don't forget to use safety-tested, shop-type electrical cords designed and rated for heavier, outdoor use.
- Never try to power house wiring by plugging the generator into a wall outlet. This practice, known as "back feeding," can lead to the electrocution of utility workers or neighbors served by the same utility transformer. The only safe way to connect a generator to house wiring is to have a qualified electrician install a power transfer switch.
- Shut down your generator correctly.

 Turn off and unplug all appliances and equipment being powered before shutting off the generator. Drain the gasoline from the generator while it is being stored, and inspect the fuel and oil filters, spark plug, oil level and fuel quality on a regular basis... and before the next power outage!

Do You Know?

Answer

The "light-line" was a string of beacon lights that went from Cleveland to Philadelphia. It was established in the 1930's to guide airplanes used for mail delivery before the advent of various air place guidance systems. The lights were spaced at 10 mile intervals and had red lights attached that would give the light number in Morse code. The pilot would fly from light to light. If you read that it was "tower 28," you would be 280 miles from Cleveland. One of the towers was located on land off from Beacon Hill Road. That area has the highest elevation in the township. The light-line ceased operation early in the 1950's.
