

West Bradford Recycles

Recycling Statistics

West Bradford residents continue to recycle increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the first quarter of 2016 approximately 30.6% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period the Township collected 885.51 tons of refuse and 390.57 tons of recyclables. With your help, we'll reach our goal of 35% recycling.



Recycling Saves Money

West Bradford pays \$63 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. Unfortunately beginning January 1, 2016, the Township no longer receives a fee for the recyclables we collect.

This is due to the current nature of the recycling industry. But the good news is that each ton of recyclables we collect saves a ton of refuse being dumped and the fee to the Township for that refuse! The more we recycle, the more we still save! In the first quarter of 2016 the Township collected 390.57 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$24,605.91 in landfill fees! Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund—helping to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible! Thank you for recycling!

Land Development Updates

The following projects are now under land development review:

- Mayfair: A 112 townhome subdivision at Boulder Drive which received preliminary approval and is now under final review.
- Caporale: A two lot subdivision at 1169 Broad Run Road under preliminary review.

The following projects are among those approved in recent years; construction has not yet begun:


- Armstrong Engineers: A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road.
- Granite & Marble World: A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton Thorndale Road.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville: A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road.

- Tattersall Phase II: A 27 single-family home subdivision on to-be-constructed Silverbark Lane, a cul-de-sac street with access onto Tattersall Way.
- Cook: A minor subdivision on Romansville Road with lot line change

The following projects are now under construction:

- Bright Glade Farm: A 37 single-family home subdivision at Glenside Road.
- Buck Hill Farm: A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane.
- Hirst: A three single-family home subdivision at Marshallton Thorndale Road and Telegraph Road.
- Marshallton Walk: A one single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road.

All project plans are available for public review at the Township Building, Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 4:30pm.



The 2016 Road Program includes repaving of the following roads:

- Telegraph Road (from Marshallton-Thorndale Rd to Sugars Bridge Rd);
- Beacon Hill Rd (from Broad Run Rd to Glenside Rd);
- Lone Eagle Road, (from Romansville Rd to Broad Run Rd);
- Sunset Drive;
- Crestmont Drive (from Marshallton-Thorndale Rd to the Saranac Development).

There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours, and at certain times sections of each road may be closed to all non-emergency vehicles. West Bradford will notify residents living on these roads in advance of the work, and the Township will provide detailed information on any required road closures. As always, we appreciate your patience as we work to improve our roads and to keep our community a great place to live!

Watershed Protection Tip

Don't Mow to the Stream-Side

Riparian buffers are the vegetated areas alongside streams. These trees, bushes and grasses are an important part of the ecosystem and vital to the health of fish and other aquatic organisms. Riparian buffers help to prevent erosion during floods, which reduces the amount of sediment and other pollutants discharged into the waterway. So if a stream meanders through your property, please do not mow down to the water's edge, but instead allow trees and bushes to grow in this area. *This Watershed Protection Tip is part of West Bradford Township's ongoing efforts to provide public education on stormwater management and the protection of our environment.*

WEST BRADFORD TOWNSHIP CODES, LAWS & SAFETY REMINDERS

Pools & Hot Tubs

Township Code requires a barrier that completely encloses any swimming pool, hot tub or spa with water more than two feet deep. A fence is the most common barrier used for swimming pools, and a safety cover is often used as a barrier for portable hot tubs. (Note: Fixed hot tubs and spas, such as those permanently mounted in a deck, are treated as pools.) All barriers must be non-climbable, at least four feet high as measured from the outside of the fence, and at least five feet removed from all property lines. In addition, all exterior entrances to the pool or spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates, and all doors leading from a residence to a pool or spa area must have audible alarms. Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must also possess a code-compliant barrier. Barrier codes are very detailed, and there are many additional requirements not noted in this article.

Please Slow Down School Is Out!

The Township frequently receives complaints about people driving too fast in residential neighborhoods. Many complaints come from residents who live on cul-de-sac streets. Since these streets have no through traffic most offenders are, in fact, neighbors. Please take the time to consider the safety of your neighbors, their children and pets. Slow down!

See and Be Seen!

If you have trouble seeing oncoming traffic when exiting your driveway, then they most likely has trouble seeing you! Trees, bushes and tall plants at your driveway entrance will cause unsafe driving conditions for you and others. All growth should be trimmed and plants and hedges should be located (or relocated) back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your line of sight. It is a violation of Township Code to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-of-way extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement. West Bradford also prohibits the growth of Bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend and break (especially when covered by snow), and fall onto neighboring sidewalks and roads. Restricting the location of Bamboo helps to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long.

Leash Law

Pennsylvania law requires dog owners to control their animals at all times. When a dog is safely confined to its owner's property, leashing isn't needed. But while the dog is on another's property a leash is the best way to control the dog. In West Bradford Parks the use of a leash is required at all times. When walking your dog (on his leash!) in a Township park, be sure to use the Mutt Mitts that are available and dispose of them in the marked containers. Don't leave your dog's mess for others to step in. Thank you for considering everyone's safety!



Signs on Your Property?

Has someone placed a sign on your property? Here's how to handle those annoying situations:

- It's a violation of Township Code to place a sign on any property without the property owner's permission.
- Signs are only permitted on the property where the activity is taking place. For example, "for sale" signs are allowed to be posted only at the property being sold. No directional signs at corners.
- A property owner may be cited for allowing an illegal sign to remain on his/her property.
- In addition to being a nuisance, roadside signs can create a hazardous condition if they distract motorists or block sight lines.

You may remove any sign placed on your property without your permission. You may also contact the



sign owner to request that a sign posted on your property be removed. If the owner will not remove the sign, please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to request enforcement action.

Signs on Public Property?

When someone places a sign on public property, at intersections or within rights-of-way, the sign is removed by our Codes Department. These signs pose a potential hazard, visual clutter to the landscape and detract from the higher quality of life our families deserve. Repeat offenders are cited for violation of the Township Code.

Recycling Ideas from the Township Codes Clerk



Recycling is a big priority for West Bradford Township. We try to make it easy and convenient and don't like saying "no." Unfortunately no Styrofoam or polystyrene may be placed in your recycling toter. You may recycle Styrofoam blocks at the Lanchester Landfill at no charge (chestercountyswa.org). Reuse Styrofoam egg cartons to plant starter seeds. Styrofoam trays can be reused under houseplants and pet food bowls or as paint trays for art projects. Electronics Recycling

Free Until December 2016

Chester County Solid Waste Authority is now accepting TV's, computers and other electronics and appliances at the Lanchester Landfill for free until December 2016. There is a three (3) unit limit per vehicle. A complete computer system is considered one unit. All items must be intact and no disassembled items will be accepted. No municipal collections will be accepted. Residents must be able to unload their own items. Items must be put on the appropriate pallet or in the labeled gaylord box. Appliances that are mostly metal should be disposed in the metals container for recycling.

Do You Know? Answer

The highest elevation above sea level in the Township is 594 feet. The location is near the intersection of Glenside Rd. and Beacon Hill Rd. The lowest elevation is 200 feet and its location is along the west branch of the Brandywine Creek near Northbrook Rd. and the village of Northbrook.



WEST BRADFORD TOWNSHIP YARD WASTE INFO

No Grass Clippings or Yard Waste In Your Toter!

The disposal of grass clippings and other yard waste in toters is prohibited by Township Code and State Law. The Township will not empty a toter that contains yard waste and fines will be issued for violations. Residents are encouraged to leave clippings on their lawn, as this supports a healthier turf by returning important nutrients to the soil. An alternative is our Compost Site. It has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to accept a very limited amount of clippings.

Before visiting the Compost Site please check westbradford.org to see if grass is currently being accepted. If you see a green light (top right), bring those clippings over! Grass clippings must be in biodegradable paper bags or may be delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck.

This service is available to residents of East and West Bradford only.

Contractors working for residents are unable to dispose of grass clippings. And, as always, the Compost Site accepts leaves and brush from East and West Bradford residents and contractors.

The site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 2 pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (driver's license) is required to dispose of waste or to collect mulch. For fees and regulations please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174, or visit westbradford.org.



The Compost Site is currently accepting grass clippings. This service is available to residents of West Bradford Township and East Bradford Township only.

It's Available – for Free!

Free mulch is available at the Compost Site at 2020 West Strasburg Road, between Lone Eagle Road and Persimmon Drive. It's a great time to beautify your landscaping and a great, natural way to prevent the growth of weeds in those prized flower beds. Mulch may also be self-loaded at no cost whenever the Compost Site is open (Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, weather permitting).

Grinder Pump Power

Does your property have a grinder pump? If yes, you know the pump will not operate when electrical power is lost. And because the pump's well stores less than a day's worth of wastewater, a prolonged power outage can be problematic. Many residents have asked about installing a back-up generator that supplies power to the pump when electricity is lost. In general, a minimum 6500W generator is required to activate a grinder pump. The Township Codes Department can assist homeowners seeking to install a generator in their home.
