

**TOWNSHIP OF WEST BRADFORD
RESOLUTION 93-15**

**A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO BE RECYCLED
THROUGH THE CURBSIDE RECYCLING PROGRAM.**

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors have established a residential curbside recycling program for West Bradford Township; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Ordinance #93-03, Section 7 d., the designation of any items for curbside collection in addition to those specified by said ordinance shall be designated by Resolution; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of Supervisors to designate additional items for curbside collection; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the environment and of the municipality to recycle additional items;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT HEREBY IS RESOLVED, THAT THE FOLLOWING RECYCLABLE MATERIALS SHALL BE COLLECTED AT CURBSIDE ON THE DESIGNATED RECYCLABLE COLLECTION DAY FOR EACH RESIDENTIAL UNIT. BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1994.

ITEM 1 - Plastics PET - #1 and HDPE #2. Not including containers that have contained hazardous materials, such as oil or antifreeze.

The plastics shall be placed in the recycling container that has been provided by the municipality and is marked "West Bradford Township Recycles Plastics". The container shall be placed at curbside on the designated collection day for that residential unit.


ITEM 2 - Steel, bi-metal cans - sometimes referred to as tin cans. Not including aerosol

cans and cans that have contained hazardous material.

The cans shall be placed in the recycling container that has been provided by the municipality and is marked "West Bradford Township Recycles Aluminum". The steel cans will thus be co-mingled with aluminum cans. The container shall be placed at curbside on the designated collection day for that residential unit.
