West Bradford Township Recycling Statistics

Since the start of single-stream recycling in 2010, West Bradford residents have recycled increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the second quarter of 2014 approximately 30.5% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period the

Township collected 1,005.8 tons of refuse and 442.3 tons of recyclables.

Fall Curbside Leaf & Brush Collection

Schedule Your Pickup Today!

This fall, West Bradford will provide curbside collection of leaves and brush on four dates during the season. All pick-ups must be scheduled at least two days in advance of the pick-up date by calling the Township Building at (610) 269-4174 or by e-mailing pmurdoch@westbradford.org. This service is available for West Bradford Township residents only. This collection is for leaves and brush only—grass clippings are not accepted!

Leaves must be placed in biodegradable paper leaf bags only, and the bags must be placed at the curbside no later than 6:00am on the day of collection. Leaves placed in any other type of container will not be collected! Bags may be purchased at the Township Building, 1385 Campus Drive, Monday through Friday, from 7:00am to 4:30pm, at a cost of \$0.50 per bag. Please do not staple bags shut.

Brush cannot be greater than four feet long, and must be less than four inches in diameter. It must be tied into bundles with a cotton or hemp twine, and the bundles must be free of plastic, trash and other debris to protect the composting equipment. The West Bradford Compost Site, 2020 West Strasburg Road, is also available for leaf and brush drop-off on Saturdays and Wednesdays from 9:00am to 2:00pm. Grass clippings are accepted at this site only when the “green light” is posted on the home page of our website, westbradford.org. Just look for the traffic signal!

Moody's Upgrades Township Bond Rating

Moody's Investors Service has upgraded its bond rating for West Bradford Township, to Aa2 from Aa3, in a ratings report issued June 30. Moody's backed its decision by noting the Township's ongoing trend of operating surpluses, which has led to "well above-average cash reserves."

"The combination of conservative budgeting and the positive income tax trend has led to reserve levels considerably stronger than [other municipalities]," noted Moody's. "Including cash held in the capital fund, which is unrestricted and usable for operating purposes, total available reserves exceed 100% of [annual] revenues."

Moody's cited West Bradford's modest debt burden and minimal pension liabilities as additional reasons backing the upgrade. The rating report can be viewed at the documents page at westbradford.org.



The improved ratings saved the Township an estimated \$80,000 in interest and bond insurance premiums on an approximate \$4 million borrowing issued in July. The Township will use these funds to purchase additional capacity at the DuPont Wastewater Treatment Plant, construct a garage to house its refuse trucks, and develop the Township's third community park at a 56-acre property at Lieds Road.



How Recycling Helps Save You – and Us! – Money

West Bradford pays \$61 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. West Bradford is paid \$5 for each ton of recyclables it collects... an amount that fluctuates with the demand for this material. In the second quarter of 2014 the Township collected 442.3 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$26,980 in landfill fees and received \$2,211 for the recycled materials. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund – which helps to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!



Did You Know? Answer

On September 11, 1777 part of the British Army, commanded by General William Howe and General Lord Charles Cornwallis, crossed the west branch of the Brandywine Creek at Trimble's Ford near Camp Linden Road. The troops proceeded east on Camp Linden Road, and through East Bradford Township, to complete a flanking movement of General George Washington's Continental Army. The maneuver occurred during the Battle of the Brandywine.

West Bradford Township Land Development Updates

The following project is now under conditional use review:

- StanAB, LP: A 126 townhome subdivision at Boulder Drive.

The following projects are now under land development review:

- Bright Glade Farm: A 38 single-family home subdivision at Glenside Road.
- Hirst: A three single-family home subdivision at Telegraph Road.
- Buck Hill Farm (formerly "Smith Farm"): A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane. This subdivision will be developed pursuant to a 2009 Court-approved Settlement Agreement.

The following land development projects are among those approved in the recent years, and construction has not yet begun:

- Armstrong Engineers: A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road.
- Faith Community Baptist Church: A 6,180 sf addition to the existing church at 1585 Glenside Road.
- Freedom Road Village: A one single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road.
- Granite & Marble World: A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton Thorndale Road.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville: A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road.

All plans are available for public review at the Township Building, Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 4:30pm. 

Safe Use of Portable Generators

Tips for long-term power outages

- Follow the directions supplied with the generator. Incorrect generator use can lead to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from the toxic engine exhaust, electric shock, or electrocution and fire. Never use a portable generator indoors, and never use a portable generator in a garage, carport, basement, crawl space or other enclosed or partially-enclosed area, even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO buildup in the home.
- Generators should be at least 20 feet away from buildings. At even 20 feet away air flow patterns may still blow carbon monoxide into homes through attic vents, windows, or doors, so keep the generator away from windows, doors, and vents, and maintain a working carbon monoxide detector inside the home.
- To avoid electrocution, keep the generator dry. Do not use in rain or wet conditions. Operate it on a dry surface under an open canopy-like structure. Make sure your hands are dry before touching the generator.
- Turn off all appliances and lights before you begin operating the generator.

Once the generator is running, turn appliances and lights on one at a time to avoid overloading the unit. And don't forget to use safety-tested, shop-type electrical cords designed and rated for heavier, outdoor use.

- Never try to power house wiring by plugging the generator into a wall outlet. This practice, known as "back feeding," can lead to the electrocution of utility workers or neighbors served by the same utility transformer. The only safe way to connect a generator to house wiring is to have a qualified electrician install a power transfer switch.
- Shut down your generator correctly. Turn off and unplug all appliances and equipment being powered before shutting off the generator. Drain the gasoline from the generator while it is being stored, and inspect the fuel and oil filters, spark plug, oil level and fuel quality on a regular basis... and before the next emergency situation!

Township Preserves Open Space

West Bradford Township has purchased a two-acre property on Marshallton-Thorndale Road, between Glenside Road and Buckingham Drive, and has preserved this land as open space. The property is part of the planned Sawmill Rd greenway on which the Township will construct a 2.8 mile on and off-road trail; when completed, the trail will connect the Township Building and Campus Park to four major subdivisions.

The property was purchased from the West Bradford Fire Company for \$25,000. The Fire Company was unable to utilize the property, and the sale proceeds will benefit this all-volunteer organization. West Bradford received a \$10,000 grant from the PECO Green Region Program, with these funds used toward the purchase of the property.

Q: What is the most popular attraction or item at Highland Orchard?

A: The primary reason most people come to Highland Orchards is for the farm experience. Tips from Jack E. Law, III, Fire Chief of West Bradford Fire Company

Check carbon monoxide alarms and smoke and fire alarms, and replace if they are older than five years. Check monthly all alarms that are less than five years old, and replace batteries when needed. If you use a natural fuel burning appliance such as a fireplace or wood, coal or pellet stove, please contract a professional to clean and check this appliance and the chimney before the season. And always use these appliances in accordance with all laws and codes. During power outages do not run generators indoors or in any attached structure, including porches. Make certain these units are placed outside with the exhaust directed away from your residence and any openings such as windows or doors.
