



Recycling Statistics in West Bradford Township

Since the start of single-stream recycling in 2010, West Bradford residents have recycled increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the fourth quarter of 2014 approximately 31.9% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period the Township collected 453.2 tons of refuse and 968.3 tons of recyclables. With your help, we'll reach our goal of 35% recycling.



Recycling Saves Residents Money



West Bradford pays \$63 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. West Bradford is paid \$7 for each ton of recyclables it collects.

In the fourth quarter of 2014 the Township collected 453.2 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$28,551 in landfill fees and received \$3,172 for the recycled materials. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund—helping to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!

Thank You Ken Klunk Community Leader and Volunteer

Ken Klunk, longtime community leader and volunteer, passed away in January at age 70. Ken served as a Township Supervisor for twelve years, during a period of much growth and change. Ken's hard work helped to provide the higher quality of life that all West Bradford families enjoy today. Ken also served as a Board Member of the West Bradford Fire Company, and he was an active volunteer with Boy Scouts Troop 52 and Cub Pack 152. In addition Ken was one of the original founders of both West Bradford Youth Athletics and the Downingtown Area Recreation Consortium, serving on the Board of Directors of each organization for many years. Ken's time with us has passed, but we continue on, surrounded by his good works and filled with good memories. And for that we thank you, Ken Klunk.

Supervisors Elect Chairman John A. Haiko in 2015

In keeping with the long-standing tradition of rotating the Chairmanship of the Board of Supervisors, Supervisor John A. Haiko was elected Chairman for 2015. Haiko began his service to the Township as a Planning Commission member in 1988 and was first elected to the Board of Supervisors in 1991.

Although the Chairman does not possess any greater legislative authority than the other Supervisors, the Chairman directs meetings and sets the meeting agenda in concert with the Township Manager. Rotation of the Chairmanship provides Supervisors with an opportunity to advance programs they believe are important for our community. Haiko is a past President of the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors. He has lived in West Bradford Township for more than 30 years. He and his wife, Carol, have three grown children—John, Stephen and Jill.

2015 Road Program

Residents will receive advance notice before work begins

This summer West Bradford Township will continue implementation of its twenty-year road program. This program is designed to maximize the useful life of infrastructure through an aggressive maintenance plan and appropriately scheduled capital improvements. The program allows the Township to maintain nearly 75 miles of roads in good condition.

The maintenance plan includes pothole repair, street sweeping, roadside brush trimming, road crack sealing and patch milling. The capital plan includes the replacement of culverts and storm water pipes and the resurfacing and reconstruction of roads. On average, the Township resurfaces and/or reconstructs between three and seven miles of roadways each year. The number of roads treated depends on

many factors, including the extent of repairs needed, the cost of materials and the damage done during the winter months. As such, road projects are often subject to change.

At this time, the projects proposed in 2015 include the repaving of:

- Adams Drive
- Lone Eagle Road, between Romansville Road and Brownsville Road
- Glenside Road, between Beacon Hill Road and Shadyside Road
- Shadyside Road, between Crestmont Drive and Glenside Road

Motorists using the above-noted roads may experience delays during construction. Residents on these roads will receive a written notice from the Township before work begins.

Humphry Marshall Historic Marker

Last October officials from the Marshallton Conservation Trust and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission gathered to dedicate a historic marker that recognizes the many contributions made by Humphry Marshall. Marshall, the most accomplished resident of the Village that bears his family name, was a gristmill owner, stonemason and famed horticulturalist. His 1785 book, *Arbustrum Americanum: The American Grove*, was the first to categorize forest tree and shrub species in America. The marker is located at the intersection of West Strasburg Road and Northbrook Road, adjacent to Marshall's former farmstead.

Kiosk Dedication Brandywine Creek Greenway

On January 17 a gateway kiosk for the Brandywine Creek Greenway was dedicated at the Brandywine Preserve trailhead on Route 322 and Bradford Avenue. The kiosk is the first of its kind to be installed along the 30-mile long greenway corridor. Brian Aaldenberg of Boy Scout Troop 52 constructed the kiosk's display case and installed landscaping, a paver patio, and benches for his Eagle Scout project. The display case will be updated seasonally with greenway and community news. The Marjorie L. and Arthur P. Miller Fund, a fund of the Chester County Community Foundation, provided a grant to assist with the project cost. Matching funds were awarded by the William Penn Foundation.

Grass Clippings Accepted at Township Compost Site

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) granted approval for West Bradford Township to accept a limited amount of grass clippings at its Compost Site. The amount of grass that can be accepted is conditioned upon the amount of leaves under compost at any given time. Before you visit the Compost Site, please check the Township website at westbradford.org to see if grass is being accepted. If you see a green light (below), it's okay to dump grass. Due to the DEP restriction, this service is available to residents of West Bradford and East Bradford only. Contractors working on behalf of residents will not be allowed to



dispose of grass clippings.

Grass clippings must be placed in biodegradable paper bags, or

delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. And, as always, the Compost Site is accepting leaves and brush from residents, non-residents and contractors. The Compost Site is located at 2020 West Strasburg Road, and is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9:00am to 2:00pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (i.e., a driver's license) is required. Marshallton Inn owner Abraham Martin's petition to operate a tavern was signed by 75 supporters... but two dozen residents challenged his application, believing that an additional tavern in the Village would lead to "mischief and disorder." At the time Center House (Martin's Tavern) was serving libations on Northbrook Road, less than 1,000 feet to the west.

Leaf & Brush Collection March 25, April 15 & May 13



West Bradford Township will offer curbside collection of leaves and brush on three Wednesdays this Spring; March 25, April 15 and May 13. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags. Bags may be purchased at the Township Building for \$0.50 per bag, or at local hardware stores. All brush must be tied with biodegradable twine (such as cotton or hemp) into manageable bundles no longer than four feet. Please note branches thicker than four inches cannot be collected. **Collection is by appointment only!** Please contact the Township at least 48 hours before your preferred collection day to ensure your spot on our list. Paper Shred & E-Waste Recycling Saturday, April 11

The service is free for all Township residents, and limited to four file size boxes per resident. Commercial waste will not be accepted. **Shred It:** Bank statements, credit card receipts, tax returns, Philadelphia 76ers postseason ticket application forms! **Recycle It:** Computers, cell phones, printers, flat-screen television sets! (Sorry... "old fashioned" cathode ray tube television sets are not accepted.)

Landfill Sets Mattress Disposal Fee

The Chester County Solid Waste Authority has enacted a new fee for the disposal of mattresses and boxsprings. Effective January 1st of this year the landfill charges an \$8 fee for each mattress or boxspring received. West Bradford Township will still collect these items, but residents must pay the \$8 per item fee to the Township in advance of pick-up. Land Development Update in West Bradford Township

The following projects are now under land development review:

- StanAB, LP: A 112 townhome subdivision at Boulder Drive.
- Buck Hill Farm: A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane. This subdivision will be developed pursuant to a 2009 Court-approved Settlement Agreement.

The following projects are among those approved in recent years, and construction has not yet begun:

- Armstrong Engineers: A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road.
- Faith Community Baptist Church: A 6,180 sf addition to the existing church at 1585 Glenside Road.
- Marshallton Walk: A one single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road.

- Granite & Marble World: A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton Thorndale Road.
- Hirst: A three single-family home subdivision at Marshallton Thorndale Road and Telegraph Road.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville: A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road.

The following projects are now under construction:

- Bright Glade Farm: A 37 single-family home subdivision at Glenside Road.
