As we close the book on 2024, it's a good time to reflect on some moments that defined our year as well as discuss some opportunities we foresee in 2025. Join me in a quick recap.

In 2024 we successfully launched our new and improved Township website. While our old site was informative, it lacked in ease of use for residents to navigate. During the winter of 2023-2024 our staff worked through the issues on the old site and carefully began crafting the updates in early 2024. Enterprise Funds in West Bradford

What is an enterprise fund? Well, I'm glad you asked. An enterprise fund is much like a private small business which operates independent of the Township's general operating fund account. Enterprise funds must be self-sustaining. In other words, the user fee established for the service should be designed to generate sufficient revenue to sustain the fund or business. Enterprise funds utilize separate accounting and are often used to fund significant capital projects. An enterprise fund is used when a service is not available to all residents of our community.

West Bradford Township operates two Enterprise Funds: Refuse / Recycling and Wastewater Treatment. Our Refuse / Recycling program only services certain residential dwellings. We do not service commercial accounts or mobile home parks. Similarly, our Wastewater Treatment Plants only serve approximately 1,000 households. Other households are either served by on-lot septic systems or a separate utility franchise, such as Community Utilities of PA, Inc. We'll talk a little about each of those funds separately.

Our Refuse / Recycling program is arguably one of the best run services around, providing trash and recycling collections for nearly 5,000 homes at one of the lowest rates in Chester County. A large percentage of the expense in operating a trash and recycling business is the tipping fee (dumping fee) to dispose of waste and recycling. For 2025, West Bradford Township will pay \$83.00 per ton to dispose of waste at the Lanchester Landfill.

Our recycling cost has dramatically increased over the past several years with tipping fees as high as \$61.00 per ton. While \$61.00 is expensive, it is still cheaper to recycle, and it is the right thing to do for the environment. West Bradford averages around 5,000 tons of waste per year and an additional 1,700 tons of recycling per year. That puts our waste disposal fee at around \$415,000.00 and an additional \$103,700.00 for recycling. These two disposal fees account for a little over 29% of our operating budget. The fund also provides for replacing one (1) refuse / recycling truck every two years. This allows us to maintain a new and reliable fleet for our services. A refuse / recycling truck now costs \$400,000.00 after municipal discounts, which represents a \$200,000.00 annual requirement or 11% of our operating budget. The refuse / recycling department employs five (5) full-time employees; four drivers and one foreman. Each of the four drivers covers two (2) trash routes and two (2) recycling routes per week. Wednesdays are designated for vehicle maintenance or collection on weeks when a holiday changes the schedule. Employee-related expenses cost us approximately \$580,000.00 annually and represent 33% of our operating cost. Diesel fuel and maintenance accounts for an additional \$262,000 per year and represents approximately 15% of our operating budget. The remaining 12% of our operating budget is dedicated to funding our compost site located at 2020 W. Strasburg Road as well as providing specific services like leaf and bulk collection, and electronic waste recycling.

We are fortunate to have a very talented and dedicated group of employees in our refuse and recycling operation. Two employees we would like to highlight are our Foreman, John Steffy and our Administrative Assistant, Paige Tomczak. Both John and Paige received their Professional Recycling Certification in 2024!

Our Wastewater Enterprise Fund is used to operate our two wastewater treatment facilities, Dupont and Strasburg Wastewater Treatment Plants. The DuPont Wastewater facility processes around 30 million gallons of wastewater per year while the Strasburg Wastewater facility processes around 20 million gallons of wastewater per year.


The total operating expense for the two treatment facilities comes in at over \$1,000,000.00 annually. The plants are operated by Scott Andress, our Public Works Director and Alex Jarvis, our Public Works Supervisor. In addition, we have a full-time Sewer Technician, Bryan Boyer, who handles all day-to-day maintenance and after-hours call outs. Our two wastewater treatment facilities serve over 1,000 households in West Bradford. Each household is charged \$900.00 annually per EDU (equivalent dwelling unit). A typically single-family home accounts for one (1) EDU. In 2016, we began to chip away at reducing the annual fee to our customers. In 2016 the rate was \$1,090.00 annually but through diligent hard work and cost saving measures, by 2022 we were able to whittle that fee down to \$900.00 annually and have held it at that rate since.

Another source of revenue for the Wastewater Enterprise Fund is the collection of tap-in fees that developers pay for the ability to use our public facilities. Over the past several years, we have collected a sizable amount of tap-in fees. Using a series of outside grant funding, we were able to expand on those funds. In 2024 alone, we sought out and were awarded nearly \$1,000,000.00 in grant funding for upgrades. In 2025, the Township will invest approximately \$2,000,000.00 of developer


fees and grant funding to update, upgrade, and improve the efficiency of our facilities. These investments should position both plants well as we move into the future. Some of the improvements include sludge removal from our storage lagoons, new energy efficient aerators, manhole relining, control upgrades, force main flushing, new HVAC, fence repairs, and changing our controls to variable frequency drives (VFD) which also reduces energy consumption. ☁

We would like to offer some colder weather tips to keep everyone safe. If you are using an auxiliary heating aid such as a pellet stove, woodstove, or fireplace please make sure to have your chimney cleaned and inspected as well as the heating appliance itself. If you have other heat sources, please make sure to follow the manufacturer's recommendations for a safe operation.

Please keep space heaters away from draperies, furniture, etc.

Please make sure your smoke/heat and carbon monoxide detectors are within date, unexpired, and have fresh batteries. There should be at least one carbon monoxide detector and multiple smoke detectors on each floor, especially in or outside your sleeping quarters.

West Bradford Fire Company is always looking for additional volunteers! We will provide you with training, protective equipment and comradery that will last a lifetime, and we get to do some really neat things! We currently have members from all occupations as well as students who are learning to become firefighters and EMTs. We are certain you will enjoy your time spent with us.

Currently we are an all-volunteer organization, our numbers are dwindling, and to keep our costs down we are seeking some new volunteers to help. In most cases a full-time paid firefighter costs approximately \$80,000.00, we would like to continue the tradition of volunteerism, however, need your support.

- You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website westbradford.org and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.

A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).

Can you be more TrashSmart? Try these ideas (or even just one!):

- Downsize – Smaller gathering, less decorations, careful gifting* so you create less waste
- Reusable, durable plates and silverware, cups, napkins, tablecloths (ask about renting)
- Shop (and wrap!) with reusable bags
- Electronic invitations – Evite®, Greenvelope, Punchbowl®
- Plan for guests to bring food in their own containers they can take back home, OR
- Have guests bring reusable containers for leftovers they may take home
- Cleaning the house – old socks for dusting rags; microfiber fleece cloths are washable
- Use vinegar for glass surfaces
- Online resources like this "Guestimator" on savethefood.com can help you plan how much food you need
- *Gifts for experiences – tickets to an event, museum or zoo membership, cooking class or trip
- *Gifts of your time – Babysitting, pet sitting, gardening help, lessons for a new hobby, teach someone a new skill
- *Gift cards for services, not goods – gas stations, car washes, hair/nail salon, massage, lawn service, audio books, pet services
- Homemade food and gifts show your creativity, time, and effort
- Wrap gifts in reusable items such as cookies in a flowerpot, or wine bottle in a new dishtowel



FENCES

Are you thinking about installing a fence on your property and wondering if a permit is required? The answer is maybe. Generally, a fence that is not more than 6 feet in height may be installed on your property and may be placed up to your property line or a street right-of-way line without the requirement of a permit. Any fence that is more than 6 feet in height does require a permit and approval from the Township prior to installation.

If you have a pool on your property, the fence may or may not be considered a safety barrier. All pools, whether in-ground or above-ground, must comply with the safety barrier requirements of the adopted building codes. There are specific requirements for height, being non-climbable, and self-closing and latching gates, as well as West Bradford Township Zoning regulations for the location of the safety barrier. Because of this there is a difference between a fence and pool safety barrier, so please keep this in mind whenever you are looking to replace any existing fence on your property. We are always happy to discuss and assist you with your projects to ensure that you get it right the first time.
