## Message from Township Manager

### Dear Residents,

We hope this letter finds you well and that you've enjoyed all that West Bradford has to offer over the summer season. As always, we want to keep you informed about the work being done on your behalf and the progress we're making together as a community.

As many residents know, the cost of refuse and recycling disposal continues to rise across the region. At West Bradford, we remain committed to finding innovative solutions that keep our refuse and recycling rates among the lowest in Chester County—all while maintaining the exceptional service our community expects and deserves.

In that spirit, our Refuse Department has partnered with SIMS Metal, a local metal recycling company, to enhance public education and provide helpful guidance to maximize household metal recycling. This collaboration not only helps divert waste from landfills but also strengthens our role as a leader in municipal recycling throughout Chester County.

At West Bradford Township, our success is driven by innovation, community spirit, and a commitment to delivering superior service. Whether it's sorting copper from recycled appliances, installing bioswales to protect our parks, or welcoming fresh faces to our team, we're proud of the progress we

continue to make—together. Stay tuned for more exciting updates and behind-the-scenes details in our next eNews!

### SHINING A SPOTLIGHT ON PARKS AND RECREATION

There's no shortage of excitement surrounding the future opening of Embreeville Park—and we're just as eager as you are. Since acquiring the property, our Public Works crews have been hard at work addressing safety concerns such as removing dead trees, repairing stormwater washouts, and clearing debris. A larger-scale improvement project is scheduled to begin late fall and winter to stabilize the interior, improve road infrastructure, repair and install stormwater systems, and address erosion.

These improvements will pave the way for the park's passive recreation opening. We've

also submitted a \$250,000 grant application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) to help fund multi-use soccer fields. A decision on that funding is expected in late fall 2025.

We look forward to hosting a "Hike with the Supervisors" event to preview the site and share the park's future—hopefully tied to a grand opening celebration! Stay tuned to our website and eNews for the latest.

Despite a few stormy setbacks this summer, our parks have remained active and full of community spirit! Mark your calendar for our annual Fall Festival at Broad Run Park on Saturday, October 11, 2025, beginning at 5:00 p.m.

We're also pleased to share that the Township has received a \$10,000 PECO Green Region Open Space Grant to install a bioswale on the western side of Shadyside Park. This sustainable feature will improve stormwater management and enhance the park's natural beauty.

## Additional Park Improvements in Progress:

- Water bottle filling stations at Shadyside (Pavilion F) and Broad Run (Pavilion B)
- Automated lighting timers at both parks

- Remote-access security cameras at Shadyside
- Handicap-accessible ramp at Broad Run Park bathrooms

## HELP KEEP BROAD RUN PARK SAFE!

Fishing in the pond at Broad Run Park or in other local waterways is something many kids—and adults—like to do.

However, staff and visitors have noticed an increase in litter, especially dangerous fishing gear such as hooks and plastic line.

No one wants their child or dog to step on a sharp hook, and no one wants a duck or turtle to get strangled in line. And we all want to be able to enjoy a clean, welcoming park! This PA Department of Environmental Protection page provides great tips for avoiding even unintentional litter, such as keeping a reusable bag in your car and adopting a "leave no trace" approach. So please make sure you pack out what you bring in and ask your family members to do the same. Trash receptacles are also available throughout the parks.

## POWER-FULL INSIGHTS

Ready for a bigger-ticket purchase?

### CHECK OUT THESE MONEY-SAVING ITEMS:

#### 1. Energy Star rated

**appliances.** This federal program has saved consumers millions of dollars through reducing electricity. Look for the Energy Star logo.



#### 2. Smart thermostats.

These allow you to schedule heating and cooling, adjust temperature remotely and even automatically based on weather reports, or respond to household motion patterns. Smart thermostats can save up to 25% of HVAC costs.

#### 3. Induction stovetops.

Safer and at least 10% more efficient than electric ranges, induction cooktops work not by heat but by generating an electromagnetic field below the cooking surface. Special cookware is required.

#### 4. Smart electrical panels or

**load managers.** If you need a panel upgrade to remodel or add a new load such as a solar battery, a smart panel or less expensive load manager (which can be added to existing panels) can provide up to 30% energy savings. Such devices monitor your household electric usage and allow you to schedule EV charging for when electricity is cheapest, show you what each circuit is costing you so that you can change usage habits, avoid electrical service upgrades, and prioritize which circuits use battery power during an outage. New functions are being added continually!

## West Bradford Township Art and History Make Great Gifts

### TEMPLE-WEBSTER-STONER HOUSE PRINTS

West Bradford Township is pleased to offer this limited edition print of one of the most historical structures in our community.

Tucked into a hillside along the banks of the idyllic Broad Run Creek, the Temple-Webster-Stoner

house is one of the region's finest aesthetically unaltered examples of "Penn Plan" architecture. Constructed in the early 1700's from local fieldstone, the house shared property with an adjacent mill for many years. The Temple-Webster-Stoner house was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1973.



Discover the story of West Bradford Township. Its rolling farmlands and winding streams have been home to the Lenape Indians, Quaker settlers and Revolutionary leaders. Its residents, including scientists, inventors, artists, explorers and movie stars, have shaped events that spurred Methodist "Thunder" revivals, the Association for the Detection of Horse Thieves, and an unexpected landing by Charles Lindbergh.

Between the Brandywines contains more than 400 pages and includes over 250 photos, maps, and drawings. The book is available for purchase at the Township Building for \$25.

## Bamboo

Throughout the township, you may have noticed the lush, vibrant stalks of bamboo along the twisting and turning roads of our community. Though this exotic plant can be a beautiful addition to cultivated landscapes, unchecked bamboo can quickly grow out of control. When bamboo grows too close to the road, its thick foliage can block or limit a driver's ability to see, which may create hazardous driving conditions. Bamboo culling is especially important in the fall and winter, since colder weather can cause bamboo to droop into roadways, blocking both sight and traffic.

West Bradford Township has an ordinance in place outlining the expectations of bamboo maintenance along public roads within the township. This ordinance can be found in our township code: Section 380 (Streets and Sidewalks), Article III (Bamboo Near Roadways).

We ask for residents with bamboo on their property to ensure the plant is always at least 40 feet away from the edge of pavement or travel lane of any public roadway. Bamboo removal requires no prior permission from the township and can be carried out in a variety of ways, both temporary and permanent. While we understand that maintenance and removal of bamboo can be an arduous and lengthy task, it is important for the safety of our residents.

The township recognizes the effort needed to maintain this invasive yet striking plant, and we are thankful for our residents' attention to the matter! As a reminder, in the fall letters will be sent to residents with noted bamboo properties reminding them of the bamboo ordinance and thanking them for their continued upkeep. We encourage our residents to reach out to the township with any questions or concerns about bamboo maintenance.



# Where to Place the Mailbox



## HERE ARE SOME HELPFUL GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW WHEN PLACING YOUR MAILBOX:

- Position your mailbox 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry.
- Place your mailbox 6" to 8" back from the curb. If you do not have a raised curb, contact your local postmaster for guidance.
- Put your house or apartment number on the mailbox.
- If your mailbox is on a different street from your house or apartment, put your full street address on the box.

## INSTALLING THE MAILBOX POST

The best mailbox supports are stable but bend or fall away if a car hits them. The Federal Highway Administration recommends:

- A 4" x 4" wooden support or a 2"-diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe.
- Avoid unyielding and potentially dangerous supports, like heavy metal pipes, concrete posts, and farm equipment (e.g., milk cans filled with concrete).
- Bury your post no more than 24" deep.

## MAINTENANCE

Mailboxes take a beating from the weather, so we recommend an annual mailbox checkup to avoid damage to your mail or difficulty identifying your address.

- Tighten loose hinges on the door
- Take care of rusty or loose parts
- Replace missing or faded house numbers
- Keep the path to your mailbox clear
