WEDNESDAY IS HOLIDAY COLLECTION DAY

If a regularly scheduled refuse, recycling or large item collection day falls on a holiday, collection for that day will be rescheduled for the Wednesday of the holiday week.

HOLIDAY:	COLLECTION IS:
Monday, May 26 (Memorial Day)	Wednesday, May 28

If your collection day for refuse and large item or recycling is on Monday, for the week of the Memorial Day holiday, your Monday collection will move to Wednesday. On Wednesday, only place out the collection (refuse and large item or recycling) that would normally occur on Monday, the holiday. Your Tuesday collection will remain on the scheduled day. *If your trash or recycling does not fall on the holiday, your schedule is not affected.*

A REMINDER: Per Township Ordinance, please do not put your recyclable toter out on refuse day, or your refuse toter out on recyclable day. Do not put trash in your recyclables or recyclables in your trash. The Township thanks you for your cooperation!



Message from PECO

We are contacting you about an upcoming project occurring in West Bradford Township that will enhance the local electric distribution system. This project is an \$837 thousand infrastructure investment in your area to help withstand more frequent and damaging storms, improve reliability by reducing the frequency of outages that cannot be prevented, and support the adoption of cleaner energy resources such as solar and electric vehicles.

What you'll see during this project:

- A machine will be used to install new conduit as well as new underground electrical cable throughout your neighborhood.
 - » Any impacted portions of yards or streets will be restored.
- New equipment, including pad-mount transformers could be installed or replaced as necessary.
 - » These devices are necessary to reduce electric voltage throughout neighborhoods and require several feet of clearance to allow for future maintenance.
- Work will occur along Bright Glade Cir, Hollow Dr, Steeple Chase Rd, Hunters Ct, Indian Trail Dr, Stonegate Dr, Old Barn Cir, Saddletree Ct, Romig Rd, Glenside Rd, Fox Trail Rd, and Sawmill Rd.
- Construction is scheduled to begin early March 2025 with an estimated completion date of June 2025.
- Work will be performed by PECO crews and qualified PECO contractors.
- We have developed a plan to minimize direct customer impact as much as possible and to complete the project in a safe and timely manner.

Crews may need to temporarily interrupt service to safely complete some of this work. We will work with local residents to ensure they are informed in advance of our activities and any planned interruptions. REMINDER: OPEN BURNING IS PROHIBITED IN WEST BRADFORD TOWNSHIP

As spring cleanup begins, please remember that burning yard waste and recyclables is not allowed in West Bradford Township. Yard waste is best handled through composting or our convenient curbside collection—available by appointment at no cost to residents. Our compost site at 2020 West Strasburg Road also offers additional disposal options. The fee schedule for provided services can be found on our website.

While some agricultural exceptions exist under the PA Right to Farm Act, open burning poses serious health and safety risks, especially for those with respiratory conditions. The Fire Department and emergency services often respond to burning complaints, typically finding residents unaware of the rules and willing to comply.

For full details, visit our website or refer to Chapter 368 of the Township Code of Ordinances. You can also contact the Township office with any questions.

ROAD WORK

The Township appreciates your patience as we work to improve our roads and keep our community a wonderful place to live. This Summer/Fall the Township plans on paving or repairing portions of the following sections of roads: Waimea Drive, Walton Drive, Chestnut Lane (Romansville Road to Broad Run Road), Winfield Drive, South Bailey Road (West Chester Road to Twp. Line), Parkview Lane, Lieds Road (Broad Run Road to Strasburg Road). We will also do curb and road repairs on Winfield Drive and Parkview Lane.

These roads may experience occasional delays during work hours and temporary road closures for non-emergency vehicles. Residents will be notified in advance of work.


Summer Camp Countdown –

West Bradford Township is excited to offer residents easy and convenient methods to pay their utility bills.

NO FEES:

- **Mail or bring a check** to the Township Building (1385 Campus Drive, Downingtown, PA 19335).
- **Online** bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- **Go to TD Bank** at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- **Set up automatic payments.** You can do this by going to our website to download the form. www.westbradford.org/documents/files/automatic-bill-payment-form-refuse-sanitary-sewer-and-hydrant-fees.

Pollinators

Pollinators—including birds, bats, butterflies, moths, flies, beetles, wasps, small mammals, as well as bees—have become an increasingly popular topic lately. Pollinators spread pollen from one plant to another, which leads to the production of fruits and seeds. Why should we be concerned about them? "75% of the world's flowering plants and about 35 percent of the world's food crops depend on animal pollinators." They are a critical part of a healthy ecosystem, and many of their populations are declining, some to critical levels. Domestic honeybee keepers have reported losses of over 30% of their bees; at least 28% of bumblebees have declined, with the Rusty-Patched Bumblebee, upon whom home gardeners depend, being listed as endangered; and 19% of butterflies are at risk of extinction. The Monarch Butterfly has experienced a 74-80% decline in population, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing that it be classified as threatened. Reasons given for the decline include loss of habitat (including food sources and nesting sites), pesticide use, climate change, and pollution. How can you help? Grow pollinator-friendly native plants, avoid pesticide use, provide nesting sites by "leaving the leaves" in the fall and not cleaning gardens up too early in the spring, and reduce light pollution. Every little bit helps.

GRINDER PUMP MAN SAYS... REMEMBER THE FLUSHABLE FOUR

1. human waste and toilet paper;
2. greywater from showers, sinks, tubs and dishwashers;
3. conventional food wastes (**not oil or grease!**) as processed through an in-sink garbage disposal unit; and,
4. laundry washing machine discharge.

These are the only four kinds of materials permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system serviced by a grinder pump. *All other materials can damage your grinder pump, and this includes all varieties of adult wipes, baby wipes and cleaning wipes. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.*

NO ELECTRICITY = NO FLUSHING

Why did sewage back up into my home during Hurricane Irene? Your grinder pump needs electricity to operate. If the electricity is out wastewater will quickly fill the grinder pump's small holding tank and eventually back into your home! (Note: The holding tank is about 100 gallons, and the average home generates approximately 200 gallons of wastewater each day.) So the next time your home loses electricity please remember to minimize all water use until the power is restored.



FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE REFUSE & RECYCLING DEPARTMENT

- **Trash Stickers: \$2.50 each,** available at the Township Building. These are for extra bags of trash only—please don't use them for large items.
- **Large Item Disposal:** Need to discard something that doesn't fit in your toter?
 - » **Free Pickup:** Place it at the curb on the last trash day of the month.
 - » **Scheduled Pickup:** Call the Township to schedule a Wednesday pickup for **\$10 per item.**
- **Recyclable Items:** Appliances like washers, dryers, stoves, hot water heaters, and gas grills are recyclable. Do not place them out for bulk pickup. Call to schedule a free Wednesday pickup.
- **Freon-containing Items** (fridges, freezers, dehumidifiers, A/C units, water coolers): Pickup fee of **\$30 per item.** Call to schedule a Wednesday pickup.
- **Dishwashers:** Not recyclable. You can place them at the curb for **free** pickup on the last trash day of the month or schedule a **\$10** Wednesday pickup.
- **Mattresses & Box Springs:** Pickup fee of **\$30 each.** Call or visit the Township office to schedule a pickup (either Wednesday or the last trash day of the month).
- **Bulk Collection:** This is for large items only. Items that fit in your toter should be disposed of there. Please don't place smaller items for bulk collection.
- **Microwaves:** Can be disposed of in your trash toter (if they fit).

Payment Info: Pickup fees can be paid in person at the Township office via cash, check, or debit/credit card. A 2.5% fee applies for debit/credit card payments. We also accept credit card payments over the phone.

Keep Lithium-Ion Batteries Out of Trash & Recycling

It is extremely likely that you have rechargeable lithium-ion batteries in your home – to power a cell phone, laptop, or power tool, for example. Batteries are both ubiquitous and confusing, having various sizes and chemistries in multiple products. They also don't last forever. It is important to know how to properly dispose of them, **ESPECIALLY** those with lithium-ion (Li-ion). From button cells to embedded ones, batteries are smaller, lighter, cheaper, but more energy-dense than ever before. Their power can make them dangerous to manage, even if you think they have lost their charge.



WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT? The two Chester County landfills that accept your trash must routinely manage potential fire conditions. Collectors of trash and recyclables must also be prepared for dangerous materials that may be hidden in residents' containers. You wouldn't want a "hot load" dumped in your neighborhood!

BASIC FACTS: Batteries are either primary (one and done), or they are rechargeable. **RECHARGEABLES DO NOT go in your recycling bin OR your trash bin.**

- Look for these symbols that mean lithium-ion in a battery: Li-ion, Li+, LiB, LIB, UN3480, and UB 3481 (if built into a product).
- Beware counterfeit Li-ion batteries; they are often made with lower quality materials and less safety features. Look for misspelled words, forged certifications, cheap packaging and pricing, and suspicious third-party sellers online.

HOW YOU SHOULD HANDLE "DEAD" BATTERIES:

- A spent battery can still have a charge. Li-ion batteries are flammable if they are punctured. It is unsafe to remove a Li-ion battery. Before battery drop-off, tape the terminals, or put the same type of batteries (all NiCad, e.g.) in a plastic bag. View the CCSWA's safety video on Chester County Solid Waste Authority's YouTube page.
- Retailers such as Staples, Home Depot, and Lowes often accept batteries. Check online or use Call2Recycle's zip code locator: [www.call2recycle.org/locator](http://www.call2recycle.org/)
- Register for a County Household Hazardous Waste event at www.chestercountyswa.org.
- Bicycle batteries: the Call2Recycle product stewardship organization that recycles batteries has partnered with People for Bikes (www.peopleforbikes.org) to collect bike batteries at retail bike shops.
- Small power equipment batteries: www.opei.org/battery-basics
- Alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, etc.) are the ONLY ones that can safely go in trash.

Batteries are getting recycled for their component metals, thereby reducing extraction needed from the earth. That is a good thing. Please be safe and responsible with your batteries.
