Tucked into a hillside on the banks of the idyllic Broad Run, the Temple-Webster-Stoner house remains one of the finest aesthetically unaltered examples of "Penn Plan" architecture. The plan is named for the room arrangement that William Penn recommended to Quaker immigrants to Pennsylvania in 1670.

Built in the early 1700's of local fieldstone, it shared property with an adjacent fulling mill for much of its past. The home has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The artist beautifully captures its history reflected in the warmth of a contemporary winter sunset.
