### WEDNESDAY IS HOLIDAY COLLECTION DAY

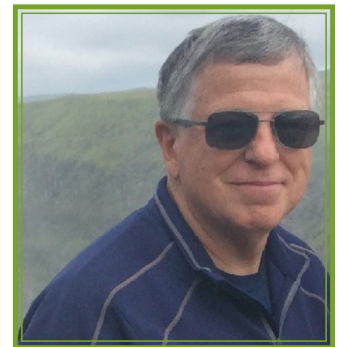

- **Online** bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- **Go to TD Bank** at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- **Set up automatic payments.** You can do this by going to our website to download the form. - Call the Township or go to the Township Building and pay by **credit card (there is a 2.50% fee).**
- You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website [westbradford.org](http://westbradford.org) and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.
- A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).

## FALL CURBSIDE LEAF AND BRUSH COLLECTION 2021

**OCTOBER 20 | NOVEMBER 3 | NOVEMBER 17 | DECEMBER 8**

This collection is for leaves and brush only... grass clippings are not accepted! All pick-ups must be scheduled by 2pm the day before the collection date by contacting (610) 269-4174, or by e-mailing [pmurdoch@westbradford.org](mailto:pmurdoch@westbradford.org). (For the Nov. 3rd collection date, scheduling must be done by Mon., Nov. 1st, 2 pm, as the office is closed on Tuesday for Election Day.) Please specify the number of leaf bags, the number of stick bags, and the number of bundled brush piles.

### THERE ARE A FEW SIMPLE RULES TO FOLLOW THAT WILL HELP US TO KEEP THIS SERVICE FREE...

- Bags must be placed curbside by 6am on the scheduled collection days.
- Leaves must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags. The bags must be free of plastic, trash, sticks and all other debris. Leaves placed in any other container, including "biodegradable" or "compostable" plastic bags and trash or recyclable totes, will not be collected.
- Sticks must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags or bundled, but can't be mixed with leaves. Bundled brush must not be longer than four feet and must be tied into manageable bundles with a cotton or hemp twine. Branches must not be thicker than four inches. The bundles must be free of plastic, trash and other debris. Branches thicker than four inches will not be collected.
- Do not staple or tape bags closed.
- Bio-degradable bags may be obtained at the Township Office, 1385 Campus Drive, at \$.50 per bag, Mon. through Fri., from 7:00 am to 4:30 pm.

Residents may also purchase bags sold at local department stores.

### Trimming too large for collection?

Shrubbery and tree trimmings up to eight inches in diameter or eight feet in length may be taken to the Lanchester Landfill in Honey Brook for a fee. Contact the landfill at (610) 273-3771 for more information.

### HHW EVENTS

Registration is REQUIRED for all HHW events, and registration takes place ONLINE a month before each event only at [www.chestercountyswa.org/121/](http://www.chestercountyswa.org/121/) Upcoming-Household-Hazardous-Waste-Event.

All listed events are open to residents of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties and Philadelphia regardless of the host county.

### NEW LIMIT ON TVS & COMPUTERS BROUGHT FOR RECYCLING AT LANCHESTER LANDFILL:

- Limit of 1 TV per household
- NO PROJECTION TVs
- Limit of 1 computer or computer peripheral per household
- You must show ID that you are a resident in our service area

This change is necessary, until further notice, due to serious capacity limitations. It is still a free service.

## New Pollinator Gardens at Broad Run and Shadyside Parks

If you've been enjoying the recreational opportunities provided by Broad Run or Shadyside Parks this past summer, you may have noticed a bit of a disturbance in the grassy areas located along the trail in both parks. Don't worry, these areas are our new pollinator gardens. This past spring, the townships Land Preservation and Sustainability Committee in cooperation with Parks and Recreation located a ¼ acre plot in each park that was prepared and seeded with plants and flowers that encourage pollinators.



Pollinators are a vital part of our ecosystem and are responsible for one-in-three bites of food we eat every day. A pollinator plays an important role in the life of flowers and in the production of fruits and vegetables. Insects, birds and mammals that carry pollen from one plant to another are called pollinators. These include native bees, ants, wasps, butterflies, moths, beetles, bats, honeybees, flies and hummingbirds. Today, pollinators face many dangers, including loss of habitat, disease, pollution and destruction by pesticides.

The pollinator gardens will provide educational opportunities to learn more about this vital ecosystem process, and in the years ahead will look great too! 🍀

## West Bradford is Ready for 100!

On March 9, 2021 the West Bradford Board of Supervisors joined 13 other Chester County communities in passing a "Ready for 100" resolution (21- 06). This resolution sets a goal of transitioning to 100% clean, renewable electricity by 2035, to become carbon neutral by 2040, and to transition to 100% renewable energy for heat and transportation by 2050. This commitment is meant to guide West Bradford Township in making prudent fiscal choices that will also utilize renewable, sustainable energy, such as solar, wind, and geothermal. For example, when a township vehicle needs to be replaced, the hope is it will be replaced with a vehicle that runs on a renewable source of energy.

None of these changes apply directly to residents on a personal level, but we hope you will see how we all benefit from doing what's best to reduce greenhouse gases. West Bradford has always been a leader in environmental stewardship, beginning with the installation of geothermal heating and cooling in both our administration building and State police barracks. By passing this resolution, West Bradford joins many communities in our area and around the world in doing our part to help address a global challenge. 🍀

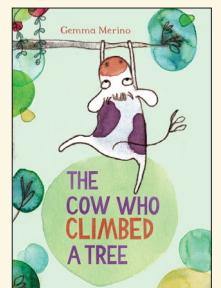
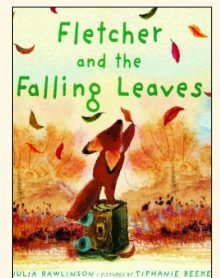

## Boy Scouts of America - West Bradford

The BSA Scouting units of West Bradford are alive and well and ready to ramp back up after the COVID-19 shutdown. We have been extremely lucky to have dedicated leaders, parents, and scouts that kept active, mostly via zoom meetings, but with the pandemic in our rear view mirror we are working on our fall recruitment.

The West Bradford scouting community has two Cub Scout Packs for children from Kindergarten thru 5th grade: Pack 215 meets at Bradford Heights Elementary and Pack 152 meets at West Bradford Elementary. Each Cub Scout Pack is divided up in dens by grade. Their activities include fun things like weekend camping (a few times a year), den meetings (once or twice a month) Pack meetings (once a month), bike rodeos, visits to the fire company or police department, model rocket launching and the most fun event in Cub Scouts, the Pinewood Derby! For kids ages 11-17, we have 2 Scouts BSA troops. Troop 19 is the first girls' BSA troop in Chester County with over 35 scouts including their first Eagle Scout. Troop 52, the boys' unit in Marshallton, has been continuously chartered since November of 1943. They have over 80 Eagle Scouts in their 78-year history. Both units camp monthly along with many other events such as first aid meets, rock climbing and hiking. They meet every Thursday (usually at the Marshallton United Methodist Church) at 7pm from September thru June.

One of the things you'll see as you travel around West Bradford is the amount of Eagle and service projects our units have done in our community. Our Eagles have made dugouts for three of the WBYA fields, kiosks at several parks and hiking trails, little libraries, pollinator gardens, headstone restorations at four local cemeteries, a picnic area for the WB Fire Department, benches and playground equipment and a prayer circle at MUMC, counselors office upgrades and benches and bookshelves at DMS, a 10k course at Cheslen, bike and PC repairs for the needy, several projects for a watershed organization, historic research and signage, a blood drive, a Veterans Memorial, and annually tending at garden dedicated to a student who passed away at WBE. Our Scouts are active in the community and it shows!

### TEMPLE-WEBSTER-STONER HOUSE PRINTS

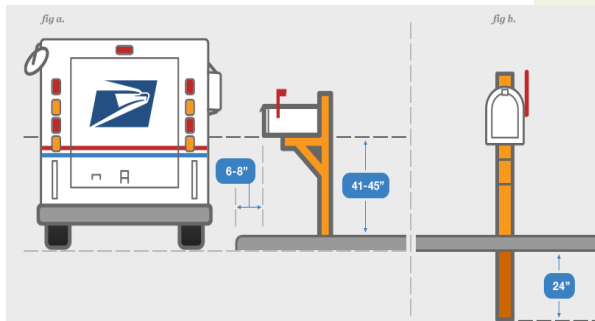
## WHERE TO PLACE THE MAILBOX

### HERE ARE SOME HELPFUL GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW WHEN PLACING YOUR MAILBOX:

- Position your mailbox 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry.
- Place your mailbox 6" to 8" back from the curb. If you do not have a raised curb, contact your local postmaster for guidance.
- Put your house or apartment number on the mailbox.
- If your mailbox is on a different street from your house or apartment, put your full street address on the box.

### INSTALLING THE MAILBOX POST:

- The best mailbox supports are stable but bend or fall away if a car hits them. The Federal Highway Administration recommends:
- A 4" x 4" wooden support or a 2"-diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe.



- Avoid unyielding and potentially dangerous supports, like heavy metal pipes, concrete posts, and farm equipment (e.g., milk cans filled with concrete).
- Bury your post no more than 24" deep.

### MAINTENANCE:

- Mailboxes take a beating from the weather, so we recommend an annual mailbox checkup to avoid damage to your mail or difficulty identifying your address.
- Tighten loose hinges on the door
- Take care of rusty or loose parts
- Replace missing or faded house numbers
- Keep the path to your mailbox clear

## REMEMBER THE “FLUSHABLE FOUR!”



If your property has  
a grinder pump, only  
four kinds of materials  
are permitted to be  
discharged into the  
sanitary sewer system...

1. Human waste & toilet paper
2. Food wastes processed through a  
garbage disposal unit (but not grease)
3. Water from sinks, tubs & dishwashers
4. Water from washing machines

All other materials can damage your  
grinder pump. This includes paint, adult  
wipes and baby wipes. Property owners  
are responsible for any damages caused  
by the discharge of prohibited materials.

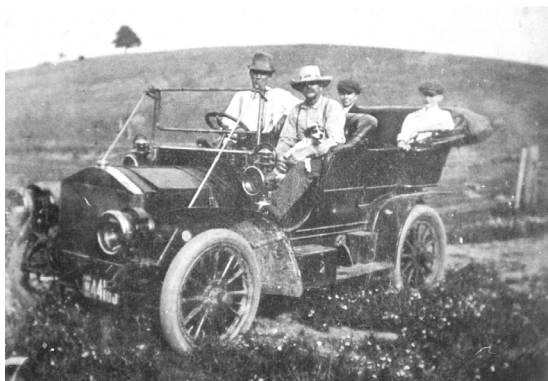
## Tips for the Safe Use of Portable Generators

During long-term power outages, many rely on portable generators for emergency power. But many generators are installed and operated incorrectly and pose a real threat to the lives of family, neighbors and utility crews working to restore service.

### FOLLOW THE TIPS BELOW WHEN INSTALLING AND OPERATING PORTABLE GENERATORS:

- Follow the directions supplied with the generator. Incorrect generator use can lead to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from the toxic engine exhaust, electric shock, electrocution and fire. Never use a portable generator indoors and never use a portable generator in a garage, carport, basement, crawl space or other enclosed or partially-enclosed area...even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO buildup in the home.
- Generators should be at least 20 feet away from buildings. At even 20 feet away air flow patterns may still blow carbon monoxide into homes through attic vents, windows or doors. Keep the generator away from these openings and maintain a working carbon monoxide detector inside the home.
- To avoid electrocution, keep the generator dry. Do not use in rain or wet conditions. Operate it on a dry surface under an open canopy-like structure. Make sure your hands are dry before touching the generator.
- Turn off all appliances and lights before you begin operating the generator. Once the generator is running, turn appliances and lights on one at a time to avoid overloading the unit. And don't forget to use safety-tested, shop-type electrical cords designed and rated for heavier, outdoor use.
- Never try power house wiring by plugging the generator into a wall outlet. This practice, known as “back feeding,” can lead to the electrocution of utility workers or neighbors served by the same utility transformer. The only safe way to connect a generator to house wiring is to have a qualified electrician install a power transfer switch.
- Shut down your generator correctly. Turn off and unplug all appliances and equipment being powered before shutting off the generator. Drain the gasoline from the generator while it is being stored, and inspect the fuel and oil filters, spark plug, oil level and fuel quality on a regular basis...and before the next power outage!
