Curbside Collection of Leaves & Brush

West Bradford Township will offer a curbside collection of leaves, sticks, and brush on three Wednesdays this Spring... March 27, April 10, and May 8. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost, as yard



waste in toters is not permitted. Repeat offenders who put yard waste in their toters will be fined. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags which may be purchased at the Township Building (\$0.50 /bag), or at local hardware stores. Please do not mix sticks in with the leaves. Place them in separate bags or bundle them together. Do not staple bags shut. All brush must be tied with biodegradable twine (such as cotton or hemp) into manageable bundles no longer than four feet. Please note that branches thicker than four inches cannot be collected. Collection is by appointment only! To ensure your spot on our list, please contact the Township at 610-269-4174 or ptomczak@westbradford.org by 2 pm the day before your preferred collection day.

Wednesday is Holiday Collection Day

If a regularly-scheduled refuse, recycling or large item collection day falls on a holiday, collection for that day will be rescheduled for Wednesday of the holiday week.

FOR THE FOLLOWING HOLIDAY: **MONDAY, MAY 27** (**MEMORIAL DAY**) REFUSE & LARGE ITEM OR RECYCLING COLLECTION WILL OCCUR ON: **WEDNESDAY, MAY 29**

This means to only put out on Wednesday whichever collection (refuse & large item or recycling) that would normally fall on Monday, the holiday. Your Tuesday collection will remain on the scheduled day,

A REMINDER: Per Township Ordinance, please do not put your recycling toter out on refuse day, or your refuse toter out on recycling day. Do not put trash in your recyclables or recyclables in your trash. The Township thanks you for your cooperation!

WAYS TO PAY FOR YOUR UTILITY BILLS

West Bradford Township is excited to offer residents easy and convenient methods to pay their utility bills.

NO FEES:

- Mail or bring a check to the Township Building (1385 Campus Drive, Downingtown, PA 19335).
- Online bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- Go to TD Bank at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- Set up automatic payments. You can do this by going to our website to download the form. www. westbradford.org/documents/files/ automatic-bill-payment-form-refusesanitary-sewer-and-hydrant-fees.

Complete the form and mail it to: West Bradford Township 1385 Campus Drive Downingtown, PA 19335

FEES:

- Call the Township or go to the Township Building and pay by credit card (there is a 2.50% fee).
- You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website westbradford.org and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.
- A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).



Residents who utilize their banking institutions "bill pay" feature, please confirm that the account number you are referencing matches exactly how it is displayed on your utility bill.

Human Foosball Court comes to Shadyside Park

Residents of West Bradford Township may wonder what the wooden structure is by the basketball court at Shadvside Park. It is a Human Foosball Court built by Kiera (Kiki) Barwell as her Gold Award Project. The Gold Award is the highest achievement within the Girl Scouts of the USA, with only 5.4% of eligible Girl Scouts successfully earning the Award. Similar to an Eagle Project, achieving the award requires a



minimum of 80 hours leading a team of volunteers in a meaningful and sustainable project for the community. After securing over \$3,000 in donations, Kiki spent 114 hours and her team volunteered an additional 212.5 hours to complete the project. Kiki chose to erect a Human Foosball Court so residents could enjoy a unique activity with friends and family. Remember the "Flushable Four!"

If your property has a grinder pump, only four kinds of materials are permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system...

- 1. Human waste & toilet paper
- 2. Food wastes processed through a garbage disposal unit (but not grease)
- 3. Water from sinks, tubs & dishwashers
- 4. Water from washing machines

All other materials can damage your grinder pump. This includes paint, adult wipes, baby wipes, and feminine hygiene products. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.

Coatesville Library VISIT THE COATESVILLE LIBRARY THIS SPRING!

As the days get warmer, Coatesville Library is looking forward to getting outside and active. Our annual partnership with Longwood Gardens and their Community Read has us thinking about the magic of getting into the garden. This year our

reads are The Last Garden in England by Julia Kelly and The Secret Garden an adaptation by Calista Brill illustrated by Adeline Lirius. We're keeping up with our health with Heart Tracks, a quarterly partnership with Penn Medicine to check our heart health, detect early risk factors, and keep us on the path to good heart health.

In April we'll be headed outside to witness a near-total Solar Eclipse. We'll be in prime position to see a 90% total eclipse here in Southeastern Pennsylvania, which won't happen again for 300 years! West Bradford Fire Company

The West Bradford Fire Co. has a very important Public Safety Announcement for all residents. There have been several incidents that WBFC has been dispatched to that involve exterior GFI or GFCI (Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter) receptacles. These receptacles are installed on the exterior of your home or building in what appears to be a weatherresistant box. At one of these incidents, rainwater had penetrated the box and caused the receptacle to catch fire and burn the wire back into the dwelling. The other incident appeared to have some moisture in the box, although this was not confirmed. We urge everyone to check and replace their exterior GFCI receptacles and boxes, with a qualified electrician if necessary, to ensure they are water resistant. We also recommend placing these outside/exterior GFCI receptacles on a GFCI breaker in your electrical panel as a safeguard. These photos are actual receptacles we removed from the exterior boxes.







As always please take extra caution during the winter months when using any auxiliary heat source such as space heaters, wood or pellet stoves, and other devices.

Chester County Camp Cadet is a fun and unique overnight summer camp for kids ages 11-13 who reside in, or attend school in Chester County. Camp Cadet of Chester County was established in 1971 as a way to promote good relations between police and young people.



Our program provides kids

with an understanding of law enforcement activities, as well as comfort with the professionals who serve their communities.

Cadets live in an atmosphere modeled after the State Police Academy, where emphasis is placed on improving self-discipline, confidence and self-esteem. During this action-packed week, Cadets will learn teamwork and the benefits of making good decisions as well as respect for authority and each other.

Troopers and other specially selected law enforcement professionals, both male and female, serve as counselors.

Our program is offered exclusively to young people residing in Chester County, at no cost to their families.

To be eligible, cadets must be at least 11 and not yet 14 by the first day of camp. Cadets must live in, or go to school in Chester County. Selection to attend our camp is based on numerous factors and is at the discretion of the Camp Director. www.cccampcadet.org.



Codes Corner

OPEN BURNING

Here in West Bradford Township the burning of yard waste and recyclables is prohibited. Yard waste materials are much more beneficial when properly composted or converted into other useable material. The Township offers curbside collections, by appointment, of leaves, sticks, and brush in the spring at no cost to our residents. Also, our own compost site, located at 2020 West Strasburg Road, offers another option with various additional services. The fee schedule for provided services can be found on our website.



The open burning of these materials can not only be dangerous, but also harmful to people with asthma and other respiratory conditions. We receive calls and complaints about burning that must be responded to by our Fire Department and emergency services team. Most often we find that the individuals involved were not aware of this regulation and are happy to comply by extinguishing the fire and taking advantage of another option. Additionally, there are exemptions and certain regulated activities that are permitted for agricultural operations in Pennsylvania. Further information and regulations can be found in Chapter 368 of the West Bradford Township Code of Ordinance, or by calling the friendly staff at the Township office.

Where to Place the Mailbox

Here are some helpful guidelines to follow when placing your mailbox:

- Position your mailbox 41" to 45" from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry.
- Place your mailbox 6" to 8" back from the curb. If you do not have a raised curb, contact your local postmaster for guidance.
- Put your house or apartment number on the mailbox.
- If your mailbox is on a different street from your house or apartment, put your full street address on the box.

Installing the Mailbox Post:


The best mailbox supports are stable but bend or fall away if a car hits them. The Federal Highway Administration recommends:

- A 4" x 4" wooden support or a 2"-diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe.
- Avoid unyielding and potentially dangerous supports, like heavy metal pipes, concrete posts, and farm equipment (e.g., milk cans filled with concrete).
- Bury your post no more than 24" deep.

Maintenance:

Mailboxes take a beating from the weather, so we recommend an annual mailbox checkup to avoid damage to your mail or difficulty identifying your address.

- Tighten loose hinges on the door
- Take care of rusty or loose parts
- Replace missing or faded house numbers
- Keep the path to your mailbox clear

If you currently have a portable net in or along the roadway, kindly move it from the street to your own property. Thank you!
