## A Letter from the Township Manager



Dear Residents,

I hope you and your family are enjoying the spring and summer season so far. Now that 2020 is in our rearview mirror, let's take a look at some projects currently underway or in the works for 2021; starting with the big one, Embreeville.

At the time of this letter, all buildings have been remediated and now are either demolished or in the stages of demolition. Our environmental consultants continue to monitor progress and perform ground testing to ensure safety and compliance with Federal, State and Local standards. We remain optimistic that demolition, restoration grading and property settlement will be completed in late 2021. While that is ongoing, the Township continues to work with the Federal Government to secure an additional \$1.5 million from the Land and Water Conservation Fund. Master planning for the complex will begin around mid-2021, pending COVID considerations.

After more than three years of negotiation, the Township has reached an agreement to purchase 108 acres of the Lenfest Farm on Groundhog College Road. The owner will retain the primary residence along with approximately 59 acres of land. The tract of land was originally proposed to have 42 homes constructed. This is another victory in the endeavor to preserve our open spaces. We have a few other preservation efforts in the pipeline that we will share with you as more details become available.

Work continues on updating our 1993 Parks and Open Space Plan. The new plan is called the Open Space, Recreation and Environmental Resource plan (OSRER). This plan will provide West Bradford with a path forward for the continued preservation of our open space and natural resources, the development of future greenways and trails, and the assessment and provision of recreational facilities and programs. You may see surveys from time to time regarding this topic. We appreciate your time in completing these. Surveys are an excellent planning tool for shaping the future.

Lastly, the Township has completed the installation of "village appropriate" lighting at the Stargazers Roundabout. Noting the installed lighting was not appropriate for a village, the Township sought funding from the State and received approximately \$100,000.00 to retrofit the lighting. The new lighting contains fewer fixtures and is of a lesser intensity. 🍃

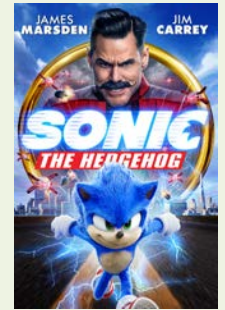

## Large Item Collection

The Township offers free collection of one large item per residence and is collected on the last trash pick-up day of each month (please see municipal calendar). Residents can schedule additional large items to be collected each Wednesday for a fee of \$10 per item.

### ACCEPTABLE LARGE ITEMS:

- Furniture
- Carpet (must be cut into 4' x 4' pieces, 4 pieces equal one large item)

### UNACCEPTABLE LARGE ITEMS:

- Excessive amounts of regular trash
- Cardboard boxes (should be recycled)
- Yard waste (should be composted)
- Building materials

If you have an item you're not sure will be considered a large item, please call the Township at (610) 269-4174.

### MATTRESSES & BOX SPRINGS

Effective August 2016, the Chester County Solid Waste Authority raised the fee for the disposal of mattresses and box springs. The landfill now charges West Bradford Township a \$25 fee for each mattress or box spring received. West Bradford Township will still collect these items, but residents must pre-pay the fee of \$20 per item to the Township in advance of pick-up. Please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to arrange pick-up.

### LARGE ITEMS THAT CONTAIN FREON

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and any other item containing refrigerant must have the Freon removed and a certification attached before they will be collected at no charge on large item pick-up day. The Chester County Solid Waste Authority website ([www.chestercountyswa.org](http://www.chestercountyswa.org)) offers a list of certified Freon removal technicians.

The Township offers an additional service that will collect these items curbside with the refrigerant still in place for a fee of \$20. After scheduling with the Township Office at 610-269-4174, items will be picked up curbside on most Wednesdays of the month. The Township will recycle the refrigerant and the metal in the appliance. *Please also remember that state law requires refrigerator and freezer doors to be removed before disposal for the protection of children.*

PECO will pick up your old, working fridge or freezer. It will be recycled and PECO will send you a \$75 check. PECO will give residents an additional \$10 for recycling a working window air conditioner at the same time. ### CATHODE TUBE TELEVISIONS

Cathode tube televisions can only be disposed of at the Chester County Solid Waste Authority (Lancaster Landfill) in Honey Brook. They will accept one television per visit after showing your driver's license proving you are a resident of Chester County.

### BATTERIES

Did you know alkaline batteries are not considered hazardous? They can be placed in regular trash. For a list of what to do with other types of batteries please visit [www.chestercountyswa.org](http://www.chestercountyswa.org). Some drop off sites can be found at [www.call2recycle.org/locator](http://www.call2recycle.org/locator). Make sure to call ahead! Other large trash items may also be dropped off at the Lancaster Landfill for a fee. Contact them at (610) 273-3771.

### PLEASE NOTE:

Effective January 24, 2013, Pennsylvania residents no longer are able to dispose of cell phones, televisions, tablets, computers, monitors and other electronic waste in their trash. These are not eligible items for large trash collection day. However, residents may drop them off at the Township office, free of charge, to be recycled.

There is no charge for washers, dryers, stoves or water heaters. Scheduling these items for Wednesday collection allows the Township to recycle them. Residents can also bring these items to our Compost Site located at 2020 W. Strasburg Road, Coatesville, PA at no charge.

## THE LAND PRESERVATION AND SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE (LPSC)

The LPSC has recently agreed to a set of adjustments in how it is organized and approaches its responsibilities. These changes are intended to address the changing priorities of the LPSC since its inception. We are forming three working groups, under the umbrella of the Committee. The first will focus on land preservation and open space efforts, the second on public education sustainability projects and programs and the third on developing and implementing (along with the Township) an Energy Transition Plan that is consistent with Resolution 21-06, sometimes known as Ready For 100.

Further, we wanted to reorganize to better serve our community and to respond to the results of our sustainability survey. If you'd like to be involved, come to our working group meetings.

## ROAD WORK

The Township sincerely appreciates your patience as we work to improve our roads and keep our community a great place to live.

Complete in-place paving will be undertaken on Manorwood Dr., Carriage Ln., Broad Run Rd. (Shadyside Rd. to Glenside Rd.), Cann Rd., Hampton Dr., Pennsford Dr., Pennsridge Pl. and Pennsridge Ct.

There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours, and at certain times sections of each road may be closed to all non-emergency vehicles. Residents living on these roads will be notified in advance of the work, and the Township will provide detailed information on any required road closures.

We hope this finds everyone healthy. We wanted to take a moment to let you know we are still here ready to respond to any emergency. The past year has been a change for us at West Bradford Fire Co, having to limit our personnel to only a few members at training nights during the height of the pandemic to keep our skills and make sure the equipment was ready for a response, having virtual meetings, taking extra precautions such as wearing additional protective equipment including but not limited to nitrile gloves, masks and Tyvek suits, among additional disinfecting procedures of apparatus and equipment, and still responding to all calls for service all while trying to keep everyone safe and healthy.



We were able to navigate through all the extras, although the hardest part for us was not being able to participate in community events, such as Fire Prevention, (which by the way, our junior members did a fabulous job of creating a virtual fire prevention series in October 2020), West Bradford Day, and other events, which we hope will be permitted sometime soon.

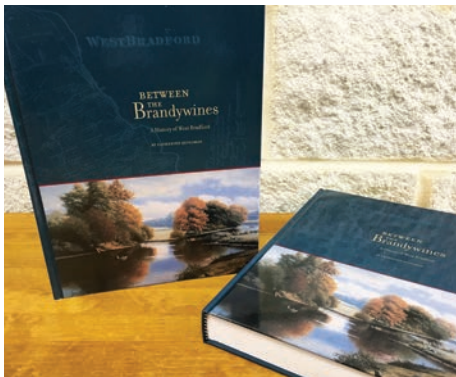

## *Between the Brandywines— A History of West Bradford Township* by Catherine Quillman

## UTILITY BILLS

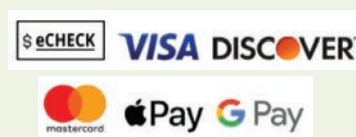
West Bradford Township is excited to offer residents easy and convenient methods to pay their utility bills.

- Online bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- Go to TD Bank at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- Set up automatic payments. You can do this by going to our website to download the form. - You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website [www.westbradford.org](http://www.westbradford.org) and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.
- A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).

\* Take off lid, dry out paint, discard can without lid; or pour paint into plastic bag with absorbent material (clay based kitty litter, saw dust, rags) place bag and can without lid, in trash. Paint hardener can also be purchased at hardware stores.

### DROP OFF GUIDELINES

- NO TVs, electronics, or appliances will be accepted.
- Event workers will unload your materials so please remain in your vehicle with your windows up.
- BUSINESSES AND CONTRACTORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY, no commercial/industrial waste accepted.
- Bring all substances in original containers with labels. Items must be identifiable. Do not mix materials.
- Gas containers returned upon request. Please attach a note to your container if you want it back.
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger container with newspaper to soak up leaks.
- Maximum amount accepted is 25 gallons or 220 pounds. No 25- or 50-gallon drums.
- There are no permanent drop off locations in the region for household hazardous waste, only the listed collections.
