Three Wednesdays This Spring: March 30, April 13 and May 18

West Bradford Township will offer curbside collection of leaves, sticks and brush on three Wednesdays this Spring; March 30, April 13 and May 18. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost, as yard waste in toters is not permitted. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags which may be purchased at the Township Building (\$0.50/bag), or at local hardware stores. Please do not mix sticks in with the leaves. Supervisors Elect Laverty Chairman in 2016

Supervisor Bruce W. Laverty was elected Chairman for 2016. He is an attorney, long-time community volunteer and past president of both the Chester County Bar Association and the Chester County Bar Foundation. Mr. Laverty has lived in West Bradford for 30+ years and began his service to the Township as a West Bradford Township Recreation Commission member in 1995. He was first elected to the Board of Supervisors in 2001. The Chairman directs meetings and sets the meeting agenda with the Township Manager, but he has no greater legislative authority than the other Supervisors. The tradition of rotating the Chairmanship provides Supervisors with an opportunity to advance programs they believe are important for our community. Members are elected to six-year terms. The terms are staggered so that a Supervisor is elected to office each odd-numbered year. 🖉

New Supervisor Sworn In Jack M. Hines, Jr.

Jack M. Hines, Jr. was sworn in as our newest Township Supervisor on January 4, 2016. Jack has lived in Marshallton since 1949. He and his wife, Marilyn, raised their three children here in West Bradford. Jack served West Bradford Township over 34 dedicated years as Manager, retiring in March of 2011. During his time as Manager, he was instrumental in growing two acres of parkland into almost 600 acres of parks and preserves, establishing our Township owned and operated refuse and single-stream recycling program, and fighting against the Strasburg Landfill in Newlin Township. The Township later purchased the West Bradford portion of land now used for our self-sustaining composting center. In November 2015, Jack's selfless style and focus on the success of the Township lead him to run for the Supervisor position. West Bradford Township 2016 Road Program

This summer West Bradford Township will continue implementation of its twenty-year road program. This program is designed to maximize the useful life of infrastructure through an aggressive maintenance plan and appropriately scheduled capital improvements. The program allows the Township to maintain nearly 75 miles of roads in good condition.

The maintenance plan includes pothole repair, street sweeping, roadside brush trimming, road crack sealing and patch milling. The capital plan includes the replacement of culverts and storm water pipes and the resurfacing and reconstruction of roads. On average, the Township resurfaces and/or reconstructs between three and seven miles of roadways each year.

The number of roads treated depends on many factors, including the extent of repairs needed, the cost of materials and the damage done during the winter months.

As such, road projects are often subject to change... but as of this time the projects proposed in 2016 include work on the following:

- Telegraph Road from Marshallton-Thorndale Rd to Sugars Bridge Rd
- Beacon Hill Road from Broad Run Rd to Glenside Rd
- Lone Eagle Road from Romansville Rd to Broad Run Rd
- Sunset Drive
- Crestmont Drive from Marshallton-Thorndale Rd to Saranac Development

Motorists using the above-noted roads may experience delays during construction. Residents on these roads will receive a written notice from the Township before any work begins.



Land Development Update

The following projects are now under land development review:

- Mayfair: A 112 townhome subdivision at Boulder Drive which received preliminary approval and is now under final review.
- Caporale: A two lot subdivision at 1169 Broad Run Road.
- Cook: A minor subdivision on Romansville Road with lot line change. The following projects are among those approved in recent years; construction has not yet begun:
- Armstrong Engineers: A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road.
- Granite & Marble World: A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton Thorndale Road.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville: A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road.
- Tattersall Phase II: A 27 single-family home subdivision on to-be-constructed Silverbark Lane, a cul-de-sac street with access onto Tattersall Way.

The following projects are now under construction:

- Bright Glade Farm: A 37 single-family home subdivision at Glenside Road.
- Buck Hill Farm: A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane.
- Faith Community Baptist Church: A 6,180 sf addition to the existing church at 1585 Glenside Road.
- Hirst: A three single-family home subdivision at Marshallton Thorndale Road and Telegraph Road.
- Marshallton Walk: A one single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road.
- Meadowview: A 69 townhome subdivision at Lone Eagle Road.

Recycling Statistics

Since the start of singlestream recycling in 2010, West Bradford residents have recycled increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a

substantial savings to our community. In the fourth quarter of 2015 approximately 30.2% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable materials. During this threemonth period the Township collected 989.17 tons of refuse and 428.87 tons of recyclables. With your help, we'll reach our goal of 35% recycling. Thank you for recycling!

Grass Clippings Accepted at Compost Site

Wednesday & Saturday, 9am to 2pm (Weather Permitting)

The Township has approval from the DEP to accept a limited

amount of grass clippings at its Compost Site located at 2020 W. Strasburg Road. The amount that can be accepted is conditioned upon the amount of leaves under compost at any given time. Before you visit the Compost Site, please check westbradford.org. If you see a green light (above), it's okay to dump grass! Due to the DEP restriction, this service is available to residents of West Bradford and East Bradford only. Contractors working on behalf of residents will not be allowed to dispose of grass clippings. Clippings must be placed in biodegradable paper bags, or delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. Proof of residency (i.e., a driver's license) is required. Recycling Saves Money

West Bradford pays \$63 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. West Bradford is paid \$7 for each ton of recyclables it collects-an amount that fluctuates with the demand for this material.

In the fourth quarter of 2015 the Township collected 428.87 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$27,018 in landfill fees by recycling and received \$3,002 for the recycled materials. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund... helping to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!
