This means to only put out on Wednesday whichever collection (refuse & large item or recycle) that would normally fall on Monday, the holiday. Your Tuesday collection will remain on the scheduled day,

SPRING LEAF, STICK AND BRUSH

Collection

Three Wednesdays This Spring:
March 30, April 13 and May 4

West Bradford Township will offer curbside collection of leaves, sticks and brush on three Wednesdays this Spring... March 30, April 13 and May 4. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost, as yard waste in totes is not permitted. Repeat offenders who put yard waste in their totes will be fined.

Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags which may be purchased at the Township Building (\$0.50 /bag), or at local hardware stores. Please do not mix sticks in with the leaves. Place them in separate bags or bundle them together. Do not staple bags shut. All brush must be tied with biodegradable twine (such as cotton or hemp) into manageable bundles no longer than four feet. Please note, branches thicker than four inches cannot be collected.

Collection is by appointment only! To ensure your spot on our list, please contact the Township at 610-269-4174 or pmurdoch@westbradford.org by 2 pm the day before your preferred collection day. 🍃

Before you visit the Compost Site, please check the Township website at westbradford.org. If you see a green light (right), the DEP has allowed us to accept grass clippings! (West Bradford and East Bradford only – no contractors working on their behalf.) Grass clippings must be placed in biodegradable paper bags, or delivered “loose”, such as in the back of a pick-up truck. Proof of residency (i.e., a driver’s license) is required. As always, leaves and brush are accepted, as well as scrap metal. Pressure treated lumber is no longer accepted.



Keystone Easy Payment Drop Box

Keystone Collections Group installed a drop box to help taxpayers make easy and timely payments on their tax bills. The box is located in front of the Chester County Intermediate Unit Building at 455 Boot Road, Downingtown, PA 19335. Residents can use the box to remit local tax returns, payments and related documents. All contents must be placed in an envelope with the taxpayer’s name, address and phone number written on the front. Cash should never be placed in the box – payment must be made only by check or money order.

The new drop box provides an alternative for residents who are concerned about the coronavirus and are trying to avoid personal contact when paying their tax bill. Residents can continue to pay taxes safely and securely online by visiting www.KeystoneCollects.com. 🍃

West Bradford Township is excited to offer residents easy and convenient methods to pay their utility bills.

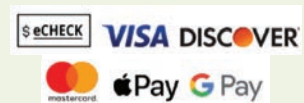
NO FEES:

- **Mail or bring a check** to the Township Building (1385 Campus Drive, Downingtown, PA 19335).
- **Online** bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- **Go to TD Bank** at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- **Set up automatic payments.** You can do this by going to our website to download the form. www.westbradford.org/documents/files/automatic-bill-payment-form-refuse-sanitary-sewer-and-hydrant-fees.

FEES:

- Call the Township or go to the Township Building and pay by **credit card (there is a 2.50% fee).**
- You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website westbradford.org and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.
- A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).



REMEMBER THE "FLUSHABLE FOUR"!

If your property has a grinder pump, only four kinds of materials are permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system...

1. Human waste & toilet paper;
2. Food wastes processed through a garbage disposal unit (but not grease);
3. Water from sinks, tubs & dishwashers; and,
4. Water from washing machines.

All other materials can damage your grinder pump. This includes paint, adult wipes and baby wipes. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.

PORTABLE BASKETBALL NETS

Residents should be aware that portable basketball nets should not be placed in or along the roadway. These nets are considered an encroachment in the public right of way and can create a safety concern for others. These nets can also hinder us in our refuse/recycling collection along with winter maintenance operations. If you currently have one, please remove it from the street and place in on your property.

Humphry Marshall BOTANISTS AND HORTICULTURIST EXTRAORDINAIRE!

In 1748, Humphry Marshall began collecting rare plants, ornamental shrubs and trees in a garden of his father's home where he resided with his wife. In 1764, he erected a greenhouse, the first in Chester County. Influenced by his cousin and predecessor, John Bartram, the "Father of American Botany," they exchanged seeds and knowledge from their respective foraging expeditions.

In 1767, Marshall began corresponding with the English Quaker Physician and Botanist, John Fothergill. This relationship would become Marshall's springboard to commercial success. Fothergill introduced Marshall to many of Europe's prominent Botanists and Aristocrats. At the time it was becoming in vogue within European Aristocracy to include American trees and plants in their gardens. It was a competition.

In 1773-74, Marshall built his own home, by hand, complete with his Botanical Garden & Arboretum, second only in America to his cousin's "Bartram's Gardens." During the Revolutionary War, while trade ebbed, Marshall continued adding to his garden and chronicling Native trees and shrubs which culminated in 1785 with the published "Arbustum Americanum: The American Grove." This was an alphabetical catalog of American trees and shrubs, the first in the Western Hemisphere. Recognized as a document of scientific importance, Marshall, with his great business acumen, also intended its use as a commercial catalog, with an eye to overseas customers.

While sales did poorly in America (it was ahead of its time) it received much acclaim and did well in Europe.

After the war and with his catalog translated into multiple European languages, the demand for Marshall's American trees and shrubs proliferated throughout

Europe. In 1784, his nephew, Moses Marshall, joined the business and together they collected, cultivated and exported to their overseas clients. Domestically, Marshall influenced many of our future botanists, horticulturists and gardens in our area. Marshall's contribution to American Horticulture and Botany were recognized in 1785 by honorary membership in The Philadelphia Society for Promoting Agriculture and election in 1786 to the American Philosophical Society, the latter of which was signed by his friend Benjamin Franklin.

Native Flowers

THE AIR IS WARMING AND THE GARDEN BECKONS!

If you are adding plants to your garden, there are good reasons to choose native varieties. Native plants are better adapted to local soils and conditions. They provide birds with food, and attract pollinators such as hummingbirds, bees, & butterflies. Once established, native plants will require little maintenance. However, native species are threatened by, amongst other things, habitat conversion and invasive exotic species. You can help by learning which species are aggressive invasives (eg. multiflora rose, Bradford pear, Burning Bush & more) and removing them.

What to plant? Where to plant it?

It pays to do a bit of research to get the right plant for the right place. With more than 2100 plants native to PA you are sure to find some that meet your soil and sun requirements. To help you get started, here are a few ideas.

- Plains Coreopsis 'Coreopsis tinctoria', Lanceleaf Coreopsis/tickseed 'Coreopsis lanceolata'. They self-seed readily and can fill your garden given half a chance.
- Scarlet bee balm 'Monarda didyma' and Wild Bergamot 'Monarda fistulosa' (lilac) tall plants that attract hummingbirds and butterflies.
- Pink, purple and orange coneflowers 'echinacea purpurea' and Prairie Blazing Star *liatris pycnostachya* (blue/purple) These plants are magnets for the Monarch and other butterflies.
- Pennsylvania has a wide variety of beautiful native trees (did you know the Oak tree supports over 4,000 different species, more than any other plant?) and bushes such as blueberry, viburnum, evergreen holly and Ilex families. They all provide for pollinators and enrich the landscape.

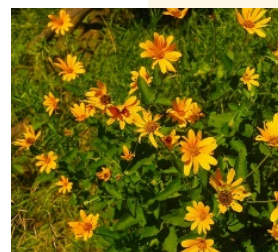
Troop 19 is celebrating their 3rd anniversary as one of the country's first ladies' troops. They participated in the council's Klondike derby doing well in all the events.

and Outreach Librarian who is adding meaningful and relevant programs for all community members.

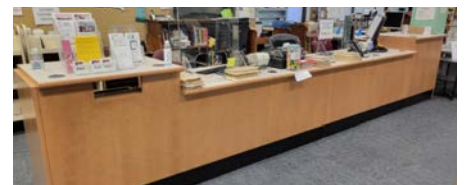

West Bradford's Energy Transition Planning team, a sub-committee of the Land Preservation and Sustainability Committee, is working hard to ensure our community remains thriving and resilient.

Thank you to all of those who have responded to our recent energy survey. The results will help us understand what West Bradford residents want and need for their homes, businesses, and lifestyles as we plan.



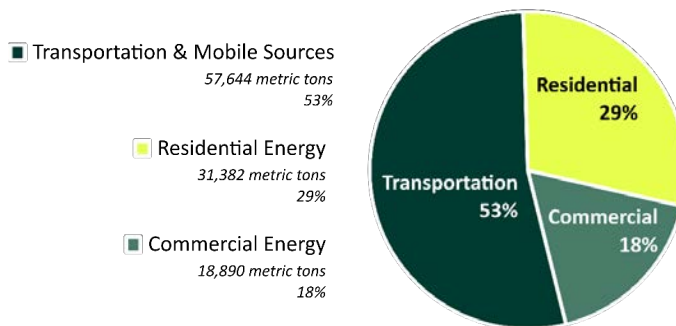
For the past three months, we have collected information about the energy our township uses. Transportation emits the most greenhouse gases, (57,644 metric tons), followed by our residential energy use (31,388 metric tons). With this information we can forecast how West Bradford's growth will lead to increased emissions and start considering changes to our municipal operations and residential habits.

Our team is also discovering how future extreme weather events will impact us. Extreme heat harms both our property and our health. As we have learned, extreme weather events may also cause power outages, flooding, and wind damage. Additionally, the actions

we take in our township directly affect neighboring communities because of, for example, how stormwater washes into low-lying areas. An Energy Transition Plan for West Bradford allows us to strategize for better safety, allocation of emergency service funds, and disaster preparedness and prevention.
