A Reminder: Per Township Ordinance, please do not put your recyclable toter out on refuse day, or your refuse toter out on recyclable day. Do not put trash in your recyclables or recyclables in your trash. The Township thanks you for your cooperation!

Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination:

llicit Discharge Detection and Elimination is a major component of West Bradford's municipal stormwater management program. Every time someone uses the storm drain or a ditch as a disposal system, they're causing an impact downstream. That's because storm sewers and ditches don't go to wastewater treatment plants. Storm drains in the Township are separated from the sanitary system. That's by design. Our wastewater treatment facilities simply couldn't handle the volume of stormwater that is created in every storm. Since this water is released unfiltered and untreated into streams, lakes and wetlands, municipalities are required to ensure that the water leaving their systems is as clean as possible. Part of that is knowing all of the sources that are flowing into the system and it's not always just water. Septic systems, used oil, carpet cleaning fluid, wastewater...you name it, someone has disposed of it into the storm system and that waste is now in our waterways. These are called illicit discharges to the storm system. Municipalities are required under the MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) regulations to identify and eliminate those illicit discharges. Below are 12 actions that homes and businesses can take to prevent illicit discharges into the storm sewer system.

Top 12 Actions: Dealing with the Dirty Dozen

- Eliminate connections to storm sewers. Make sure that wastewater, spills or soapy water can't flow into a storm sewer by any drain or stormwater flow.
- 2. Store hazardous materials properly, inside or under cover.
- Make a current spill response plan and clean up kit accessible.
- Train employees on spill response and good housekeeping practices. Repeat training regularly.
- 5. Use "dry" methods for clean up and spills. Keep a broom, mop and kitty litter or other absorbent materials handy. Do not use water to rinse off a spill.
- **6.** Use a mop sink for cleaning floor mats and equipment. Pour wash water in the sink, not outside.
- Ensure dumpsters remain covered and leak-proof. Locate dumpsters away from storm drains.
- 8. Wash vehicles at a commercial car wash. If you must wash vehicles or equipment outdoors, use water only, or wash on grassy areas and divert soapy water from storm drains.

- Keep parking lot and service areas clean. Provide trash bins and empty them regularly. Divert water from loading docks.
- 10. Keep wetlands and areas around ponds and streams clean and in natural condition. Keep these areas free of trash, yard waste, and debris that can pollute or obstruct water flow. If possible, allow vegetation to grow into a natural buffer instead of mowing to wetland edges.
- **11. Water wisely and limit fertilizer use.**Keep water and fertilizer on the grass, not pavement. Consider replacing some lawn area with low-care plantings.
- **12. Design your site to infiltrate, filter or detain runoff.** Divert roof leaders,
 foundation drains, air conditioning
 condensate and other clean water to
 grassy areas, away from pavement
 and stormdrains.

This Watershed Protection Tip is part of West Bradford Township's ongoing efforts to provide public education on stormwater management and the protection of our environment.

West Bradford Township will offer curbside collection of leaves, sticks and brush on three Wednesdays this Spring... March 28, April 18 and May 9. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost, as yard waste in toters is not permitted. Repeat offenders who put yard waste in their toters will be fined. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags which may be purchased at the Township Building (\$0.50 / bag), or at local hardware stores. Please do not mix

sticks in with the leaves. Place them in separate bags or bundle them together. Do not staple bags shut. All brush must be tied with biodegradable twine (such as cotton or hemp) into manageable bundles no longer than four feet. Please note branches thicker than four inches cannot be collected. Collection is by appointment only! To ensure your spot on our list, please contact the Township at 610-269-4174 or at pmurdoch@westbradford.org by 2 pm the day before your preferred collection day.

West Bradford Compost Site Bring Us your Grass Clippings!



Grass Clippings

Before you visit the Compost Site, please check the Township website at westbradford.org. If you see a green light (to the right), the DEP has allowed us to accept grass clippings! (West Bradford and East Bradford only—no contractors working on their behalf.) Grass clippings must be placed in biodegradable paper bags, or delivered "loose,"



such as in the back of a pick-up truck. Proof of residency (i.e., a driver's license) is required. As always, leaves and brush are accepted.

29.3% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period, the Township collected 1,378 tons of refuse and 403.75 tons of recyclables, saving us \$26,243.75 in landfill fees. West Bradford Township has a goal of 35% recycling. Please help us reach this goal!

West Bradford Township 2018 Road Program

This spring and summer West
Bradford Township will continue
implementation of its twenty-year
road program. This program is
designed to maximize the useful life of
infrastructure through an aggressive
maintenance plan and appropriately
scheduled capital improvements.
The program allows the Township to
maintain nearly 75 miles of roads in
good condition.

The maintenance plan includes pothole repair, street sweeping, roadside brush trimming, road crack sealing and patch milling. The capital plan includes the replacement of culverts and storm water pipes and the resurfacing and reconstruction of roads. On average, the Township resurfaces and/or reconstructs between three and seven miles of roadways each year.

The number of roads treated depends on many factors, including the extent of repairs needed, the cost of materials and the damage done during the winter months. As such, road projects are often subject to change... but as of this time the projects proposed in 2018 include work on the following:

The unimproved section of Telegraph Road east of Sugars Bridge Road and Broad Run Road from Strasburg Road to Telegraph Road will be improved with a new base course of asphalt. Resurfacing of roadways will take place on Romig Road, South Bailey Road, Sawmill Road and Glen Drive

Motorists using the above-noted roads may experience delays during construction. Residents on these roads will receive a written notice from the Township before any work begins.

Downingtown Area Recreation Consortium Celebrates its 25th Year!



Did you know that 2018 is the 25th anniversary of DARC's

founding? We've been around for so long that, to most of our residents, DARC gets taken for granted. As we look back and celebrate this milestone we wanted to share with you our history and purpose.

What is DARC? DARC is short for the Downingtown Area Recreation Consortium. We serve the recreational needs of over 69,000 residents made up of 40,000 households. DARC is the largest recreational provider in Chester County. We are an independent organization (Council of Government) that was created by the eight municipalities that make up the Downingtown Area School District. We are governed by a Board made up of representatives from each member municipality and one from the School District.

When Chester County was growing rapidly 25 years ago, our municipalities had the foresight to think ahead. It was decided that each municipality would focus on what they did best—provide parks and local community-based events.

But it was determined that it would be much more efficient—from a tax dollar perspective and in cheaper recreational costs to the residents—to form an organization that served the recreational programming needs of everybody in the school district.

Because of our size we are able to provide a much broader range of recreational opportunities than any single municipality could. We are able to keep our programming costs down because our municipalities and the school district graciously provide spaces to run our programs in. We are also able to negotiate with outside, for-profit recreational providers for better program rates for our residents.

We do all this, each and every day, at an annual cost in tax dollars to your municipality of less than \$1 per person. That's a bargain anyway you look at it.
