Between the Brandywines

The Land Preservation and Sustainability Committee (LPSC) is working hard to preserve natural resources and scenic landscapes in West Bradford Township. Interest in preserving open space is high and LPSC is currently working with several landowners and land conservation organizations to add more protected acres in West Bradford.

LPSC is working with Brandywine Conservancy to complete a land preservation plan for West Bradford Township that will describe the processes and criteria used to guide the committee in its efforts to protect land through both agricultural and conservation easements. The plan is expected to be completed by the end of 2019.

In addition to open space preservation, an important part of LPSC's charter is to educate landowners about the importance of preserving our natural ecosystems and watersheds. All of the minor streams in the Township are tributaries to either the East or West Branches of the Brandywine or the Broad Run. West Bradford is in a very unique position because the Broad Run watershed basin is located entirely within the Township. The health of the stream is entirely within the Township's control from a land use perspective. The Broad Run is classified as an Exceptional Value stream by the Commonwealth. This is the highest water quality designation in the State. LPSC is working closely with the Brandywine Conservancy on expanding Township residents'

understanding about this resource and how each and every one of us can help to preserve this wonderful and important resource. More information will be available over the summer.

As a result of the very successful "Conservation Conversation" held at Temenos in January, we are planning another event for this summer. The January event focused on land preservation and included experts who discussed the preservation options available to West Bradford residents. Stay tuned for more information on our next educational event. What You Can Do to Prevent Stormater Pollution

Riparian buffers are the vegetated areas alongside streams. These trees, bushes and grasses are an important part of the ecosystem and vital to the health of fish and other aquatic organisms. Riparian buffers help to prevent erosion during floods, which reduces the amount of sediment and other pollutants discharged into the waterway. So if a stream meanders through your property, please do not mow down to the water's edge, but instead allow trees and bushes to grow in this area. \gg

Road Department Updates: 2019 Road Program

The Township sincerely appreciates your patience as we work to improve our roads and keep our community a great place to live. Plans include base course application to unimproved section of Broad Run Road between Telegraph and Clayton Roads, as well as in-place paving to complete Romig Road, Stonegate Drive, Sawmill Road, a portion of Glen Drive, Kerwood Lane, Lawson Lane and Decatur Court. There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours, and at certain times sections of each road may be closed to all non-emergency vehicles. Residents living on these roads will be notified in advance of the work, and the Township will provide detailed information on any required road closures.

Grinder Pump Power

If your property has a grinder pump, then you know the pump will not operate when electrical power is lost. And because the pump's well stores less than a day's worth of wastewater, a prolonged power outage can be problematic. Many residents have asked about installing a back-up generator that supplies power to the pump when electricity is lost. In general, a minimum 6500W generator is required to activate a grinder pump.

West Bradford Township Recycles!



The more we recycle, the less refuse we have to dispose of at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. Every

dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund—helping to keep our collection fee as low as possible. The Township pays \$65 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. The Township pays a fee of \$25 for each ton of recyclable materials we dispose of. The markets for these materials have significantly changed and buyers are much more particular in the products they will process. It is more important than ever that our materials are clean, so we request that you continue to follow our guidelines. Our only change in materials collected is that we no longer accept shredded paper. Visit our website or call our office if you have questions or need additional information. In the first quarter of 2019 approximately 27.8% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this threemonth period, the Township collected 954.06 tons of refuse and 366.44 tons of recyclables, saving us \$14,657.60 in landfill fees. West Bradford Township has a goal of 35% recycling. Please help us reach this goal!

No Grass Clippings Allowed in Toters

The disposal of grass clipping and other yard waste in toters is prohibited by Township Code and State Law. The Township will not empty a toter that contains yard waste and fines will be issued for violations. Residents are encouraged to leave clippings on their lawn to support a healthier turf by returning important nutrients to the soil. An alternative is our Compost Site. It has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to accept a very limited amount of clippings.



Before visiting the Compost Site, please check westbradford.org to see if grass is currently being accepted. If you see a green light (like the one shown below), bring those clippings over! Clippings must be in biodegradable paper bags or may be delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. This service is available to residents of East and West Bradford only, no contractors working for residents.

And, as always, the Compost Site accepts leaves and brush from East and West Bradford residents and contractors. The site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 2pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (driver's license) is required to dispose of waste or to collect mulch. For fees and regulations please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174, or visit westbradford.org. *P*

The West Bradford Township Historical Commission invites you to a guided tour of the Village of Marshallton on Thursday, July 25, 2019 starting at 5:30pm The Village of Marshallton, a National Historic District, began in the early 1700's as a cluster of houses near the Center House and grew into a more linear village as Strasburg Road became a main thoroughfare for farmers and tradesmen to bring their wares to market. Marshallton today features 50 older dwellings, two historic inns, a blacksmith shop, two places of worship, and three cemeteries. These structures have been used throughout the last 250+ years as shops and living quarters. These homes are living antiques in the village that is relatively unchanged from colonial times. The guided tour begins at 5:30pm on July 25, 2019 and starts at the Marshallton United Methodist Church. The tour is held rain or shine. No advance tickets are needed. This tour is part of the Chester County Preservation Network's Summer Walks program. The Historical Commission is looking for volunteers to act as guides. West Bradford Township Codes, Laws & Safety Reminders

Pool & Hot Tub Regulations

Barrier fences must completely enclose any swimming pool or any fixed hot



tub/spa permanently mounted in a deck. Safety covers are used as a barrier for portable hot tubs.

SOME BARRIER REGULATIONS:

- Non-climbable
- At least four feet high as measured on the outside of the fence
- At least five feet from all property lines
- All exterior entrances to the pool or spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates
- All doors leading from residence to pool or spa area must have audible alarms
- Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must also possess a code-compliant barrier.

School is Out PLEASE SLOW DOWN

The Township frequently receives complaints about people driving too fast in residential neighborhoods. Many complaints come from residents who live on cul-de-sac streets. Since these streets have no through traffic most offenders are, in fact, neighbors. Please consider the safety of your neighbors, their children and pets. Slow down!


See and Be Seen!

It is a violation of Township Code to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-ofway extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement. Tall vegetation at your driveway entrance causes unsafe driving conditions for you and others, so keep them trimmed or relocate them further back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your sight line.

West Bradford also prohibits the growth of Bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend, break and fall onto neighboring sidewalks and roads (especially when covered by snow). Restricting the location of Bamboo helps to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long.

Leash Law

Pennsylvania law requires dog owners to control their pets by leash while the dog is on another's property. In



West Bradford Parks the use of a leash is required at all times! While in the parks, please be sure to use the available Mutt Mitts and dispose of them in the marked containers. Don't leave your dog's mess for others to step in. Thank you for considering everyone's safety!

Signs on Your Property?



It's a violation of Township Code to place a sign on any property



without the property owner's permission. The property owner may remove these signs and may also contact the sign owner for removal. If the sign owner will not remove it, please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to request code enforcement action.

Signs are only permitted on the property where the activity is taking place. For example, "for sale" signs are allowed to be posted only at the property being sold. No directional signs at corners.

A property owner may be cited for allowing an illegal sign to remain on his/ her property.

Signs on public property, intersections or within rights-of-way cause visual clutter, pose a potential hazard by blocking site lines and detract from the quality of life our families deserve. Our Codes Department removes these signs and repeat offenders are cited for violation of the Township Code.
