Land Preservation & Sustainability Committee

The Land Preservation and Sustainability Committee held its second annual “Conservation Conversation” on January 22nd at Temenos to educate West Bradford landowners about the benefits of land conservation and agricultural easements. Experts from the Brandywine Conservancy provided an overview of West Bradford’s efforts and progress toward preserving open space, and explained options for conservation and agricultural easements.

One West Bradford family who recently put their property under easement described their positive experience with the easement process. In addition, Meagan Hopkins-Doerr, Chester County Master Gardener and Chester and Delaware Counties Master Watershed Steward Coordinator, discussed what landowners can do to address the problem of spotted lanternflies.

Another recent conservation success story is Castle Rock Farm. Fifty-four acres of this picturesque property along the Brandywine River have now been preserved for future generations. 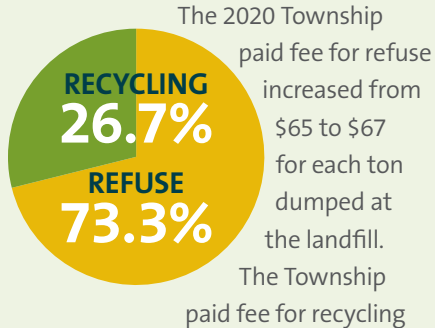

West Bradford Recycles!



The 2020 Township paid fee for refuse increased from \$65 to \$67 for each ton dumped at the landfill. The Township paid fee for recycling increased from \$25 to \$40 for each ton of recyclable materials we dispose of. The markets for these materials have significantly changed and buyers are much more particular in the products they will process. We request that you continue to follow our guidelines as it is more important than ever that our materials are clean. Please remember that we can no longer accept shredded paper. Visit our website or call our office if you have questions or need additional information. In the first quarter of 2020 approximately 26.7% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period, the Township collected 1,017.81 tons of refuse and 371.45 tons of recyclables, saving us \$10,029.15 in landfill fees. West Bradford Township has a goal of 35% recycling. Please help us reach this goal! The more we recycle, the less refuse we have to dispose of at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund... helping to keep our collection fee as low as possible.



No Grass Clippings Allowed in Toters

The disposal of grass clipping and other yard waste in toters is prohibited by Township Code and State Law. The Township will not empty a totter that contains yard waste and fines will be issued for violations. Residents are encouraged to leave clippings on their lawn to support a healthier turf by returning important nutrients to the soil. An alternative is our Compost Site. It has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to accept a very limited amount of clippings.

(Please note that we may have to close the Compost Site due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Check the website and follow us on Facebook for updates.)

Before visiting the Compost Site, please check westbradford.org to see if grass is currently being accepted.

If you see a green light (right), bring those clippings over! Clippings must be in biodegradable paper bags or may be delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. This service is available to residents of East and West Bradford only, no contractors working for residents.



And, as always, the Compost Site accepts leaves and brush from East and West Bradford residents and contractors. The site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 2 pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (driver's license) is required to dispose of waste or to collect mulch. For fees and regulations please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174, or visit westbradford.org.

NEED MULCH?

A limited amount of free mulch is available at the Compost Site at 2020 West Strasburg Road, between Lone Eagle Road and Persimmon Drive. It's a great time to beautify your landscaping and a great, natural way to prevent the growth of weeds in your flower beds. Mulch may also be self-loaded at no cost whenever the Compost Site is open (Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, weather permitting).

Road Department Updates: 2020 Road Program



The Township sincerely appreciates your patience as we work to improve our roads and keep our community a great place to live. Base course will be applied to unimproved section of Sawmill Road from Old Shadyside to the north approximately 2,000 feet. Complete in-place paving will be undertaken on Wawaset Road, Creagh Knoll Lane, Creagh Knoll Terrace,

Manorwood Drive, Carriage Lane and a portion of Poorhouse Road. There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours, and at certain times sections of each road may be closed to all non-emergency vehicles. Residents living on these roads will be notified in advance of the work, and the Township will provide detailed information on any required road closures. ♪

Prevent Stormwater Pollution: What You Can Do



Riparian buffers are the vegetated areas alongside streams. These trees, bushes and grasses are an important part of the ecosystem and vital to the health of fish and other aquatic organisms. Riparian buffers help to prevent erosion during floods, which reduces the amount of sediment and other pollutants discharged into the waterway. So if a stream meanders

through your property, please do not mow down to the water's edge, but instead allow trees and bushes to grow in this area. ♪

Although life looks quite different at the moment, the Downingtown Area Recreation Consortium (DARC) is continuing to plan a variety of fun and educational summer programs for children and teenagers in West Bradford Township.

Our low-cost, high-energy playground camp for children ages three through 11 will be held at West Bradford Elementary School from 9am to noon on Mondays through Thursdays. The campers will spend plenty of time outdoors, and they'll play group games, create crafts, and make friends. Children may attend one or more weeks of camp. West Bradford Elementary School staff member Linda McCain will return as the site supervisor.

We will also run adventure, nature, science, and art-related camps. Broad Run Park will be the home of a Soccer Shots program for children ages two to eight, a nature camp for youngsters ages four to eight, and a basketball

camp for youths ages six to 14. The adventure camps will take daily excursions. Middle-school campers can expect to take in a Phillies game and spend time at the Aerial Adventure Park at Hellerick's Family Farm, the Philadelphia Zoo, Clyde Peeling's Reptiland, and the beach at Sea Isle City. Elementary school students will visit Hellerick's Adventure Farm, Go 'N Bananas Family Fun Center, Black Rock Retreat, Dutch Wonderland, Dutch Springs Aqua Park, and more.

West Bradford Township Codes, Laws & Safety Reminders

Pool & Hot Tub Regulations

Barrier fences must completely enclose any swimming pool or any fixed hot tub/spa permanently mounted in a deck. Safety covers are used as a barrier for portable hot tubs.



SOME BARRIER REGULATIONS:

- Non-climbable
- At least four feet high as measured on the outside of the fence
- At least five feet from all property lines
- All exterior entrances to the pool or spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates
- All doors leading from residence to pool or spa area must have audible alarms
- Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must also possess a code-compliant barrier.

School is Out

PLEASE SLOW DOWN

The Township frequently receives complaints about people driving too fast in residential neighborhoods. Many complaints come from residents who live on cul-de-sac streets. Since these streets have no through traffic most offenders are, in fact, neighbors. Please consider the safety of your neighbors, their children and pets. Slow down!

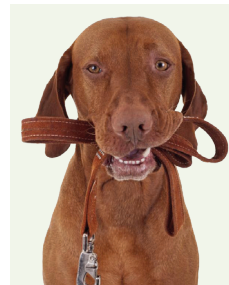
See and Be Seen!

It is a violation of Township Code to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-of-way extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement. Tall vegetation at your driveway entrance causes unsafe driving conditions for you and others, so keep them trimmed or relocate them further back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your sight line.

West Bradford also prohibits the growth of Bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend, break and fall onto neighboring sidewalks and roads (especially when covered by snow). Restricting the location of Bamboo helps to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long.

Leash Law

Pennsylvania law requires dog owners to control their pets by leash while the dog is on another's property. In West Bradford Parks the use of a leash is required at all times! While in the parks, please be sure to use the available Mutt Mitts and dispose of them in the marked containers. Don't leave your dog's mess for others to step in. Thank you for considering everyone's safety!

Signs on Your Property?

It's a violation of Township Code to place a sign on any property without the property owner's permission. The property owner may remove these signs and may also contact the sign owner for removal. If the sign owner will not remove it, please contact the Township at 610-269-4174 to request code enforcement action. Signs are only permitted on the property where the activity is taking place. For example, "for sale" signs are allowed to be posted only at the property being sold. No directional signs at corners. A property owner may be cited for allowing an illegal sign to remain on his/her property. Signs on public property, intersections or within rights-of-way cause visual clutter, pose a potential hazard by blocking site lines and detract from the quality of life our families deserve. Our Codes Department removes these signs and repeat offenders are cited for violation of the Township Code.



Grinder Pump Power

If your property has a grinder pump, then you know the pump will not operate when electrical power is lost. And because the pump's well stores less than a day's worth of wastewater, a prolonged power outage can be problematic. Many residents have asked about installing a back-up generator that supplies power to the pump when electricity is lost. In general, a minimum 6500W generator is required to activate a grinder pump.
