This is great news for the Committee and has led to the current consideration of five (5) active land preservation projects, and approximately three hundred and eighty-one (381) acres for easement.

West Bradford Township Wins "Best Community in Chesco 2018"

In the fourth year of the March Madness tournament to claim the Best Community in Chester County, we are proud to announce West Bradford Township was victorious! The bracket style tournament to showcase community pride and engagement included six rounds across three weeks of voting (where approximately 2,000 votes were cast). It covered 64 Chester County communities in four (4) divisions—Boroughs/Cities, Northern Townships, Southern Townships, and Eastern Townships, all battling for the title of "Best Community in Chesco 2018." This year marks the first time in the four years of the tournament a township defeated a

borough in the championship. West Bradford Township crushed two-time champ Downingtown Borough 67-33% of votes. The tournament is a product of DOES Co., a local Marketing Agency, and was sponsored by their new coworking company Work2gether. Work2gether is a shared workspace on main street in Downingtown, offering flexible and affordable monthly memberships for work spaces that are ideal for businesses, entrepreneurs, and freelancers working from home or from local coffee shops. The space provides members with a built-in framework of essential business services, amenities, and, most importantly, people with whom to network and collaborate.

West Bradford Township Recycling Statistics

Please help West Bradford Township reach our goal of 35% recycling! Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill,

for a substantial savings to our community and a great help to our environment! Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund...helping to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible. The Township pays \$65 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. In the first quarter of 2018 approximately 29.8% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period, the Township collected 908.15 tons of refuse and 385.14 tons of recyclables, saving us \$25,034.10 in landfill fees. Thank you for your help and keep reycling!

West Bradford Township Codes, Laws & Safety Reminders

Pool & Hot Tub Regulations

Barrier fences must completely enclose any swimming pool or any fixed hot



tub/spa permanently mounted in a deck. Safety covers are used as a barrier for portable hot tubs.

SOME BARRIER REGULATIONS:

- Non-climbable
- At least four feet high as measured on the outside of the fence
- At least five feet from all property lines
- All exterior entrances to the pool or spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates
- All doors leading from residence to pool or spa area must have audible alarms
- Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must also possess a code-compliant barrier.

School is Out

PLEASE SLOW DOWN

The Township frequently receives complaints about people driving too fast in residential neighborhoods. Many complaints come from residents who live on cul-de-sac streets. Since these streets have no through traffic most offenders are, in fact, neighbors. Please consider the safety of your neighbors, their children and pets. Slow down!

See and Be Seen!

It is a violation of Township Code to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-of-way extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement.

Tall vegetation at your driveway entrance causes unsafe driving conditions for you and others, so keep them trimmed or relocate them further back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your sight line. West Bradford also prohibits the growth of Bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend, break and fall onto neighboring sidewalks and roads (especially when covered by snow). Restricting the location of Bamboo helps to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long.

Leash Law

Pennsylvania law requires dog owners to control their pets by leash while the dog is on another's property. In West Bradford



Parks the use of a leash is required at all times!

While in the parks, please be sure to use the available Mutt Mitts and dispose of them in the marked containers. Don't leave your dog's mess for others to step in. Thank you for considering everyone's safety!

Signs on Your Property?



It's a violation of Township Code to place a sign on any property without the property owner's permission. The property owner may remove these signs. Property owners may also contact the sign owner for removal. If the sign owner will not remove it, please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to request code enforcement action.

INFORMATION ABOUT SIGNS PLACED ILLEGALLY ON YOUR PROPERTY:

- Signs are only permitted on the property where the activity is taking place. For example, "for sale" signs are allowed to be posted only at the property being sold. No directional signs at corners.
- A property owner may be cited for allowing an illegal sign to remain on his/her property.
- Signs on public property, intersections or within rights-of-way cause visual clutter, pose a potential hazard by blocking site lines and detract from the quality of life our families deserve. Our Codes Department removes these signs and repeat offenders are cited for violation of the Township Code.

No Grass Clippings or Yard Waste in Your Toter

The disposal of grass clippings and other yard waste in toters is prohibited by Township Code and State Law. The Township will not empty a toter that contains yard waste and fines will be issued for violations. Residents are encouraged to leave clippings on their lawn to support a healthier turf by returning important nutrients to the soil.



An alternative is our Compost Site. It has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to accept a very limited amount of clippings.

Before visiting the Compost Site, please check westbradford.org to see if grass is currently being accepted. If you see a green light (inset), bring those clippings over! Clippings must be in biodegradable paper bags or may be delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. This service is available to residents of East and West Bradford only, no contractors working for residents.

And, as always, the Compost Site accepts leaves and brush from East and West Bradford residents and contractors. The site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9:00am to 2:00 pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (driver's license) is required to dispose of waste or to collect mulch. FREE PAPER SHRED & E-WASTE RECYCLING EVENT SATURDAY JUNE 2, 2018

In cooperation with area municipalities, West Bradford Township will host a paper shred and electronic waste recycling event on Saturday, June 2, 2018 in the parking lot of the Thorndale K-Mart from 9:00am to noon.

The service is free for all Township residents. Commercial waste will not be accepted. Document shredding is limited to four file-size boxes per resident.

E-waste incudes computers, LCD monitors, laptops, printers, open toner cartridges, wire, cables & AC Adapters, flat screen & plasma TVs, cell phones,

ipods, digital cameras, dvd & vcr players, CRT (tube-type) and LCD TV's will be accepted for a fee of \$20 to \$40, depending on size of unit.

Need Mulch?

A limited amount of free mulch is available at the Compost Site (2020 West Strasburg Rd). It's a great time to beautify your landscaping and a natural way to prevent the growth of weeds in your flower beds. Mulch may also be self-loaded at no cost when the Compost Site is open (Weds and Sat from 9am to 2pm), weather permitting.

Grinder Pump Power

A grinder pump will not operate when electrical power is lost. And because the pump's well stores less than a day's worth of wastewater, a prolonged power outage can be problematic.

Residents have asked about installing a back-up generator that supplies power to the pump when electricity is lost. A minimum 6500W generator is required to activate a grinder pump. For permit and additional info contact Jim Lucas, Codes Director, at (610) 269-4174, or jlucas@westbradford.org.

Watershed Protection Tip

Riparian buffers are the vegetated areas alongside streams. These trees, bushes and grasses are an important part of the ecosystem and vital to the health of fish and other aquatic organisms. Riparian buffers help to prevent erosion during floods, which reduces the amount of sediment and other pollutants discharged into the waterway. So if a stream meanders through your property, please do not mow down to the water's edge, but instead allow trees and bushes to grow in this area.

This Watershed Protection Tip is part of West Bradford Township's ongoing efforts to provide public education on stormwater management and the protection of our environment.

West Bradford Fire Company A Message from the Fire Chief, Jack E. Law, III



West Bradford Fire Co. is looking for your help. What would happen if volunteers did not volunteer? Do you have some extra time and would like to volunteer to help in your community? Ever think of what it would be like to ride on a fire truck to an emergency?

HERE ARE SOME FACTS:

In the late 1970's there were about 300,000 volunteers across the Commonwealth. Today that number has drastically decreased to about 60,000 and the cost to the residents would be approximately \$14 billion per year to replace volunteer fire fighters. We can help you with those items as we offer free training, Personal Protective Equipment, camaraderie and a sense of satisfaction knowing that you could help someone in need.

Did you know that in 1736 the first volunteer fire department was founded by Benjamin Franklin in Philadelphia, PA? The West Bradford Fire Company was formed in 1953, so we are relatively young; however, we have a wealth of knowledge and friendships to offer you.

West Bradford Fire Company has about 28 volunteers that respond and handle emergencies, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. We are teachers, trades persons, laborers, admin assistants, truck drivers, retired persons and the list goes on. We handle emergency responses, special assignments, administrative functions, building maintenance on our stations and many other functions that you may be able to help with. On average we respond to 320-340 emergency calls per year and spend many hours training every Thursday evening. We have two stations, nine pieces of apparatus that serve West Bradford Township, and portions of East Bradford and Newlin Townships.

Come up and visit and see what we can offer, stay as long as you would like, but we would guess once you stop by you will be back; just as the volunteers that we currently have when they stopped to visit. Help us, help you. Let's show that you can increase the number of volunteer firefighters in our community. Or if you feel that you cannot volunteer, we operate and rely on contributions from our residents and communities. Please consider donating during our annual fund drive.
