Can You Compost in the Winter? Absolutely!

Just follow these tips:

- Harvest your finished compost and spread it on flower or vegetable beds. That way, it does its slow work of enriching soil throughout winter.
- Decomposition progresses more slowly in cold weather, so reducing the size of what you put in your pile can help by giving the beneficial organisms more surface area to feed on.
- Many practitioners argue about whether piles need more dry "brown" (straw, leaves, etc.) than wetter "green" (vegetable waste, coffee grounds, etc.) materials, but having more brown than green over the winter prevents a soggy pile once our wet spring hits.
- Insulate your pile with additional brown material to maintain

a temperature at which some decomposition can occur. In the spring, remove any extra amounts of this insulation and add it as the season progresses.

- Don't worry about turning your pile in the winter.

In any season, don't add material treated with herbicides to compost piles, since it can be long-lasting and harm your garden.

HOA forbids composting? Talk to your Board about changing this – or about establishing a neighborhood household compost area!

WAYS TO PAY FOR YOUR UTILITY BILLS

West Bradford Township is excited to offer residents easy and convenient methods to pay their utility bills.

NO FEES:

- **Mail or bring a check** to the Township Building (1385 Campus Drive, Downingtown, PA 19335).
- **Online** bill pay through your bank (make sure to reference your 10 digit account number).
- **Go to TD Bank** at 3821 W Lincoln Highway, Downingtown, PA 19335 (only this branch) and bring your payment stub and check.
- **Set up automatic payments.** You can do this by going to our website to download the form. www.westbradford.org/documents/files/automatic-bill-payment-form-refuse-sanitary-sewer-and-hydrant-fees.

FEES:

- Call the Township or go to the Township Building and pay by **credit card (there is a 2.50% fee).**
- You may also make a payment by phone or check your account balance 24/7 with our automated phone service. Call (844) 810-7245 or make a payment by going to our website westbradford.org and click Online Payments. There is a per transaction limit of \$300.00.
- A service fee of \$4.50 will be applied to all credit card payments and a fee of \$1.50 will be applied to all payments made via electronic check (ACH/EFT).



Residents who utilize their banking institutions "bill pay" feature, please confirm that the account number you are referencing matches exactly how it is displayed on your utility bill.



TOWNSHIP SECURE DROP BOX

Have you seen the new secure drop box at the Township Building? Did you walk past it too? We will accept payment in envelopes with a bill stub (no cash please), Building permit applications and Zoning permit applications when we aren't in the office. This will make things more accessible if you want to stop here before 7:00am or after 4:30pm or even on the weekend!

REMEMBER THE "FLUSHABLE FOUR!"

If your property has a grinder pump, only four kinds of materials are permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system...



1. Human waste & toilet paper
2. Food wastes processed through a garbage disposal unit (but not grease)
3. Water from sinks, tubs & dishwashers
4. Water from washing machines

All other materials can damage your grinder pump. This includes paint, adult wipes, baby wipes, and feminine hygiene products. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.

Snowy Winter Roads

Prior to snow beginning to fall, and when conditions warrant, the Township applies a salt brine mixture to the roadway surface to prevent the formation of ice. Once snow begins to fall, granular salt is applied. Trucks then work to plow the roadways, following specific routes that clear emergency routes and high-priority roads first. Cul-de-sacs and other secondary roads are not plowed until all emergency routes and high-priority roads are passable.



Our Public Works team will always do their very best to keep roadways as clear as possible, as quickly as possible, but we need your help! When the first snowflakes begin to fall, please remember to...

- **Remove vehicles from the roadway until the roadway is cleared.** Vehicles parked on the roadways during winter weather events will be ticketed. Vehicles parked on emergency routes may be ticketed and towed.
- **Wait until the roadway is cleared before shoveling your driveway, sidewalk and mailbox area.** If you must clear these areas sooner, please know Township trucks will likely throw snow back onto your property when plowing the road.
- **Do not shovel snow into the roadway.** Pushing snow from your driveway or sidewalk into the roadway creates a safety hazard and could cause an accident. Property owners may be held responsible for accident damages.
- **Prepare your vehicle for winter driving.** And if you are too nervous about driving on snow and ice, don't drive! Share a ride with a neighbor or wait until the roadways are cleared before traveling.

The Township does not plow private roadways, roadways not dedicated to the Township, and most State-owned roadways. West Strasburg Road, Marshallton-Thorndale Road, Northbrook Road, Romansville Road, Downingtown Pike (Route 322), Embreeville Road, Bradford Avenue, Brandywine Drive, Glenside Road (from Beacon Hill Road into Downingtown), Camp Linden Road and Stargazers Road are maintained by the Commonwealth. Please contact the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation at (610) 436-2091 to report snow removal concerns at these roadways.

We thank you for your continued patience and understanding while we continue to keep our roads safe during this winter season. 🍂

Codes Corner

The West Bradford Township Zoning Ordinance regulates the size and placement of different types of signs that may be installed in the Township. There are many types of signs, and each serves a different purpose or function. According to the Township's Ordinance, the purpose of the regulations is to promote the safety of persons and property by providing that signs do not create traffic hazards by distracting or confusing motorists, or impairing motorists' ability to see pedestrians, other vehicles, obstacles or to read traffic signs. Regulating signs also minimizes clutter, unsightliness, and confusion.

Signs are classified by use, construction, and design. The placement of each type of sign is also regulated and at no time is a sign, other than an official sign, permitted to be attached to traffic signs, public utility poles, or trees within the right-of-way of any street or placed on or in any roundabout, traffic island or other traffic-calming feature. Because signage is protected by the First Amendment right to free speech, signs cannot be regulated based on their content.

Most signs require a zoning permit to ensure that they meet all Township requirements. There are, however, certain signs that do not require permits or approval from the Township such as professional or address signs, real estate signs, identification signs, and temporary signs which include election signs that are posted on your own property.

All of the Township's sign regulations can be found in the Township Code of Ordinance, Section 450-69, which is available on our website at www.westbradford.org. If you find the Ordinances difficult to navigate, please do not hesitate to contact us directly, and the Township staff will be glad to assist you. 📝

- *Gifts of your time – Babysitting, pet sitting, gardening help, lessons for a new hobby, teach someone a new skill
- *Gift cards for services, not goods – gas stations, car washes, hair/nail salon, massage, lawn service, audio books, pet services
- Homemade food and gifts show your creativity, time, and effort
- Reusable, useful containers such as cookies in a flowerpot, or jewelry in a new pair of gloves

COMPOST: Evergreens, tea bags, coffee grounds, leaves, twigs, fresh cranberries

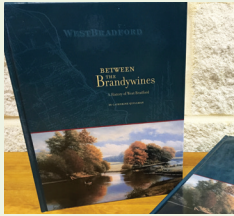
