

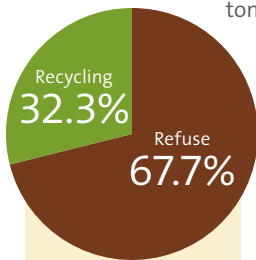

West Bradford Township Recycling Statistics

Since the start of single-stream recycling in 2010, West Bradford residents have recycled increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the fourth quarter of 2013 about 32.3% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable material. During this three-month period the Township collected 955.2 tons of refuse and 455.6 tons of recyclables.

2014 Road Program

Residents will receive advance notice before work begins

This summer West Bradford Township will continue implementation of its twenty-year road program. This program is designed to maximize the useful life of infrastructure through an aggressive maintenance plan and appropriately scheduled capital improvements. The program allows the Township to maintain nearly 75 miles of roads in good condition.

The maintenance plan includes pothole repair, street sweeping, roadside brush trimming, road crack sealing and patch milling. The capital plan includes the

replacement of culverts and storm water pipes and the resurfacing and reconstruction of roads.

On average, the Township resurfaces and/or reconstructs between three and seven miles of roadways each year.

The number of roads treated depends on many factors, including the extent of repairs needed, the cost of materials and the damage done during the winter months. As such, road projects are often subject to change.

At this time the projects proposed in 2014 include the repaving of:

- Old Shadyside Road;
- sections of Broad Run Road; and,
- sections of Shadyside Road.

Motorists using the above-noted roads may experience delays during construction. Residents on these roads will receive a written notice from the Township before any work begins.



How Recycling Helps Save You – and Us! – Money

West Bradford pays \$61 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. West Bradford is paid \$5 for each ton of recyclables it collects... an amount that fluctuates with the demand for this material. In the fourth quarter of 2013 the Township collected 455.6 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$27,792 in landfill fees and received \$2,278 for the recycled materials. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund – which helps to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!

Did you know that our storm sewer system does not provide treatment for the removal of pollutants? The system is designed to carry stormwater and snow melt directly to basins and creeks. So when litter, oil and other materials make their way to the inlet, our community's groundwater and waterways are threatened. You can help protect our environment by not dumping items into the storm sewer. And if you see something on the roadway that doesn't belong, please pick it up for proper disposal. *This Watershed Protection Tip is part of West Bradford Township's ongoing efforts to provide public education on stormwater management and the protection of our environment.*

Did You Know?

Answer

Lone Eagle Road was named after the "Lone Eagle," an airplane owned by famed aviator Charles Lindbergh. In March 1928, while flying from New York to Washington, Lindbergh made an unscheduled stop in West Bradford, landing the Lone Eagle on a muddy field near the present-day road. The plane was a twin of the "Spirit of St. Louis."

Remember the "Flushable Four"



If your property has a grinder pump, only four kinds of materials are permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system:

- Human waste & toilet paper
- Food wastes processed through a garbage disposal unit (but not grease)
- Water from sinks, tubs & dishwashers
- Water from washing machines

All other materials can damage your grinder pump, and this includes all varieties of adult and baby wipes. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.

West Bradford Township will offer curbside collection of leaves and brush on three days in

2014 – March 26, April 16 and May 14. This convenient service is available to West Bradford residents at no cost. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable collection bags. Bags may be purchased at the Township Building for \$0.50 per bag, or at local hardware stores. All brush must be tied with biodegradable twine (such as cotton or hemp) into manageable bundles no longer than four feet. Please note branches thicker than four inches cannot be collected.

Land Development Update *in West Bradford Township*

The following land development projects are now under review:

- Smith Farm – A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane. This subdivision will be developed pursuant to a 2009 Court-approved Settlement Agreement.

The following land development projects are among those approved in recent years:

- Armstrong Engineers – A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Bright Glade Farm – A 63 single-family home subdivision on Glenside Road. Construction has not begun.
- Faith Community Baptist Church – A 6,180 sf addition to the existing church at 1585 Glenside Road. Construction has not begun.
- Freedom Road Village – A 1 single-family home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Granite & Marble World – A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton Thorndale Road. Construction has not begun.
- Meadowview – A 69 townhome subdivision at the intersection at Lone Eagle Road and Chestnut Lane. Construction is underway.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville – A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Tattersall, Phase V – A 12 single-family home subdivision at the intersection of Whiffeltree Lane and West Strasburg Road. Construction is underway.

All plans are available for public review at the Township Building, Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 4:30pm.

The West Bradford Fire Company responded to 340 alarms in 2013. These alarms included automobile accidents, house fires, fire alarms and many other emergencies. The time spent by our volunteers responding to these alarms totaled more than 300 hours. In addition to answering the community's call for help, our dedicated volunteers logged more than 2,700 hours in training, sponsored fire prevention programs in area schools, manned traffic details, and conducted fundraisers needed to support our all-volunteer organization. Grass Clippings Accepted *at our Township compost site*

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) granted approval for West Bradford Township to accept a limited amount of grass clippings at its Compost Site. The amount of grass that can be accepted is conditioned upon the amount of leaves under compost at any given time.

Before you visit the Compost Site, please check the Township website at westbradford.org to see if grass is being accepted. If you see a green light (below), it's OK to dump grass!

Due to the DEP restriction, this service is available to residents of West Bradford and East Bradford only. Contractors working on behalf of residents will not be allowed to dispose of grass clippings. Grass clippings must be placed in biodegradable paper bags, or delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck. And, as always, the Compost Site is accepting leaves and brush from residents, non-residents and contractors. The Compost Site is located at 2020 West Strasburg Road, and is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 2pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (i.e., a driver's license) is required. For Compost Site fees and regulations contact the Township at (610) 269-4174, or visit westbradford.org.
