West Bradford Township Recycling Statistics

Since the start of single-stream recycling in 2010, West Bradford residents have recycled increasing amounts of materials. Recycling greatly reduces the amount of refuse required to be disposed at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. In the first quarter of 2014 approximately 32.6% of that collected at the curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period the Township collected 835.9 tons of refuse

Pool and Hot Tub Regulations

Do it Right, Do it Safe!

ennsylvania's Uniform Construction Code requires a barrier that completely encloses any swimming pool, hot tub or spa with water more than two feet deep. A fence is the most common barrier used for swimming pools, and a safety cover is often used as a barrier for portable hot tubs. (Note: Fixed hot tubs and spas, such as those permanently mounted in a deck, are treated as pools.)

All barriers must be non-climbable, at least four feet high as measured from the outside of the fence, and at least five feet removed from all property lines. In addition, all exterior entrances to the pool or spa area must possess self-closing and locking gates, and all doors leading from a residence to a pool or spa area must have audible alarms.

Above-ground pools with steps or ladders, or pools with sides less than four feet above ground level, must also possess a code-compliant barrier.

Barrier codes are very detailed, and there are many additional requirements not noted in this article. Please contact Jim Lucas, Codes Director, at (610) 269-4174, or at jlucas@westbradford.org, before purchasing and installing a pool, hot tub or spa.

2014 Road Program

The 2014 Road Program includes repaying of the following roads:

- Broad Run Road, from Poorhouse Road to West Chester Road;
- Crestmont Drive, from Marshallton-Thorndale Road to Shadyside Road;
- Shadyside Road, from Oak Hollow Drive to Crestmont Drive; and,
- Woodward Drive, from Crestmont Drive to Shadyside Road

There will be occasional delays on these roads during work hours, and at certain times sections of each road may be closed to all non-emergency vehicles. West Bradford will notify residents living on these roads in advance of the work, and

the Township will provide detailed information on all required road closures. As always, we



appreciate your patience as we work to improve our roads and to keep our community a great place to live! »

See and Be Seen!

If you have trouble seeing oncoming traffic when exiting your driveway, then it's likely oncoming traffic has trouble seeing you. Trees, bushes and tall plants at your driveway entrance will cause this problem. We recommend you trim all growth that interferes with your line of sight. If hedges are used for privacy or sound barriers, please consider relocating these back from the road to an area that will not interfere with your line of sight. In addition, it is a violation of Township Code to plant trees or bushes, or to locate any structures, within the right-of-way of the street. The right-of-way extends beyond the paved portion of the street. And while the width of the right-of-way varies by street, along many roads the right-of-way extends approximately 12 feet from the edge of pavement. West Bradford also prohibits the growth of bamboo within 40 feet of all public roads. Bamboo can bend and break (especially when covered by snow), and fall onto neighboring sidewalks and roads. Restricting the location of bamboo helps to keep our sidewalks and streets safe and passable all year long. @



How Recycling Helps Save You – and Us! – Money

West Bradford pays \$61 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill. West Bradford is paid \$5 for each ton of recyclables it collects... an amount that fluctuates with the demand for this material. In the first quarter of 2014 the Township collected 404.9 tons of recyclables. This means the Township saved \$24,699 in landfill fees and received \$2,025 for the recycled materials. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund – which helps to keep our annual collection fee as low as possible!

When Someone Puts a Sign on Your Property

ign on your property? Here's some helpful information when confronted by these pesky postings:

- It is a violation of Township Code to place a sign on any property without the property owner's permission.
- Signs are only permitted on the property where the activity is taking place. For example, "for sale" signs are allowed to be posted only at the property being sold.
- A property owner may be cited for allowing an illegal sign to remain on his or her property.
- In addition to being a nuisance, roadside signs can create a hazardous condition if they distract motorists or block sight lines.

You may remove any sign placed on your property without your permission. You may also contact the sign owner to request that a sign posted on your property be removed. If the owner will not remove the sign, please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174 to request enforcement action.

When someone places a sign on public property, at intersections or within rights-of-way, the sign is removed by our Codes Department. In addition to posing a potential hazard, these signs add visual clutter to the landscape and detract from the higher quality of life our families deserve.

Repeat offenders may be cited for violation of the Township Code.





Camp Cadet Program August 10-15

he Pennsylvania State Police are once again proud to offer "Camp Cadet," a free, weeklong overnight summer camp for boys and girls ages 11 to 13 that aims to promote a positive relationship between law enforcement officials and young persons. PA State Troopers, municipal police officers and deputy sheriffs serve as camp counselors and instructors, teaching real-life law enforcement techniques to the Cadets. Throughout an action-packed week filled with hands-on activities the Cadets learn teamwork and good decision-making. Camp life is modeled after the State Police Academy, and is designed to strengthen Cadets' selfdiscipline, self-esteem and respect for the community. Did You Know? Answer

The water was delivered by siphon. The ten-inch main, which crossed the present day Brandywine Ridge subdivision, rose to an elevation about 45 feet higher than the reservoir surface, before gradually falling 125 feet to the Borough below. At its peak elevation the main employed an air value to evacuate the line and draw water from the reservoir.

Free Mulch Available at the Compost Site

Free mulch is available at the Compost Site at 2020 West Strasburg Road, between Lone Eagle Road and Persimmon Drive. It's a great time to beautify your landscaping, and there's no better, natural way to prevent the growth of weeds in those prized flower beds. Grinder Pump Power

Does your property have a grinder pump? If yes, you know this pump will not operate when electrical power is lost. And because the pump's well stores less than a day's worth of wastewater a prolonged power outage, like the one experienced last winter, can be very problematic. Many residents have asked about installing a back-up generator that supplies power to the pump when



electricity is lost. In general, a minimum 6500W generator is required

to activate a grinder pump. The Township Codes Department can assist homeowners seeking to install a generator in their home. For permit and additional information contact Jim Lucas, Codes Director, at (610) 269-4174, or at jlucas@westbradford.org.

Summer Yard Clean-Up

No Grass Clippings or Yard Waste in Your Toter!

he disposal of grass clippings and other yard wastes in toters is prohibited by state law! The Township will not empty any toter that contains yard waste, and fines will be issued for violations. Residents are encouraged to leave clippings on their lawn, as this supports a healthier turf by returning important nutrients to the soil. Still want to bag your grass clippings? The Compost Site has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to accept a very limited amount of clippings. Before visiting the Compost Site please check westbradford.

org to see if grass is being accepted. If you see a green light, bring those clippings over! Grass clippings must be in biodegradable paper bags, or delivered "loose," such as in the back of a pick-up truck.

Due to the restricted amount of grass clippings, this service is available to residents of West Bradford and East Bradford only. Contractors working for residents are unable to dispose of grass clippings. And,



as always, the Compost Site accepts leaves and brush from East and West Bradford residents and contractors. The Compost Site is open each Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 2 pm, weather permitting. Proof of residency (a driver's license) is required to dispose of waste or to collect mulch. For fees and regulations please contact the Township at (610) 269-4174, or visit westbradford.org.

Land Development Updates

The following land development projects are now under review:

- Smith Farm: A 129 single-family home subdivision at Chestnut Lane. This subdivision will be developed pursuant to a 2009 Court-approved Settlement Agreement.
- Hirst Subdivision: A four single-family home subdivision at Telegraph Road and Marshallton-Thorndale Road.

The following land development projects are among those approved in recent years:

- Armstrong Engineers: A 10,000 sf office building at 1845 West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Bright Glade Farm: A 63 single-family home subdivision on Glenside Road.
 Construction has not begun.
- Faith Community Baptist Church:
 A 6,331 sf addition to the existing church at 1585 Glenside Road.

 Construction has not begun.

- Freedom Road Village: A 1 singlefamily home and 12 twin home subdivision at 1440 West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Granite & Marble World: A 25,000 sf warehouse and office building at 1401 Marshallton-Thorndale Road. Construction has not begun.
- Meadowview: A 69 townhome subdivision at the intersection at Lone Eagle Road and Chestnut Lane. Construction is underway.
- Stargazer Village at Romansville: A 95 single-family home and 39 townhome subdivision at the intersection of Stargazer Road and West Strasburg Road. Construction has not begun.
- Tattersall, Phase V: A 12 single-family home subdivision at the intersection of Whiffletree Lane and West Strasburg Road. Construction is underway.

All plans are available for public review at the Township Building.
