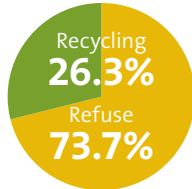

Recycling Statistics



The more we recycle, the less refuse we have to dispose of at the landfill, for a substantial savings to our community. Every dollar saved and earned is retained in the Refuse Fund; helping to keep our collection fee as low as possible. The Township pays \$65 for each ton of refuse dumped at the landfill and \$25 for each ton of recyclable materials we dispose of. The markets for these materials have significantly changed and buyers are much more particular in the products they will process. It is more important than ever that our materials are clean. Visit our website or call our office if you have questions. In the second quarter of 2019, approximately 26.3% of that collected curbside was recyclable materials. During this three-month period, the Township collected 1,105.33 tons of refuse and 393.43 tons of recyclables, saving us \$15,737.20 in landfill fees. West Bradford Township has a goal of 35% recycling. Please help us reach this goal!

Wednesday is Holiday Collection Day

If a regularly-scheduled refuse, large item or recycling collection day falls on a holiday, collection for that holiday will be rescheduled for the Wednesday of the same week the holiday (or holiday-observed date) falls in.

FALL CURBSIDE LEAF AND BRUSH COLLECTION 2019



This fall, West Bradford Township will provide curbside collection of leaves and brush on the following four Wednesdays:

OCTOBER 23, NOVEMBER 6, NOVEMBER 20 AND DECEMBER 4

The collection is for leaves and brush only. Grass clippings are not accepted! All pick-ups must be scheduled by 2:00pm the day before the collection date by contacting the Township office at (610) 269-4174, or by e-mailing pmurdoch@westbradford.org. (Please note that for the November 6th collection date, scheduling must be done by Monday, November 4th, 2 P.M. as the office is closed on Tuesday for Election Day.) Please specify the number of leaf bags, the number of stick bags, and the number of bundled brush piles, as different trucks are used to collect these different types of yard waste.

THERE IS NO COST FOR THIS SERVICE, BUT THERE ARE A FEW SIMPLE RULES TO FOLLOW THAT WILL HELP US TO KEEP THIS SERVICE FREE:

- Bags must be placed at curbside by 6:00am on the collection days.
- Leaves must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags. To avoid damaging the equipment used to compost the leaves, the bags must be free of plastic, trash, sticks and all other debris.
- Leaves placed in any other container, including trash and recyclable totes, will not be collected. This includes all varieties of “biodegradable” or “compostable” plastic bags.
- Sticks must be placed in bio-degradable paper collection bags or bundled, but sticks can't be mixed with leaves.
- Bundled brush must not be longer than four feet and must be tied into manageable bundles with cotton or hemp twine. Bundles must be free of plastic, trash and other debris to protect the composting equipment.
- Branches thicker than four inches will not be collected.
- Do not staple or tape yard waste bags closed.
- Bio-degradable bags may be obtained at the Township Office, 1385 Campus Drive, at a cost of \$0.50 per bag, Monday through Friday, from 7:00am to 4:30pm. Residents may also purchase bags sold at local department stores.

Can't make the above dates work in your schedule? No problem! The West Bradford Compost Site (2020 West Strasburg Road), is also available for leaf and brush drop-off on Saturdays and Wednesdays from 9:00am to 2:00pm. Grass clippings are accepted at this site only when the “green light” is posted at westbradford.org. Just look for the traffic signal. Trimmings too large for collection? Shrubbery and tree trimmings up to eight inches in diameter or eight feet in length may be taken to the Lanchester landfill in Honey Brook for a fee. The landfill will not accept root balls, dirt or stones. Contact the landfill at (610) 273-3771 for more information. ✍

Portable Basketball Nets

Basketball nets should not be placed in or along the roadway. These nets are considered an encroachment in the public right of way and can create a safety concern for others. These nets can also hinder us in our refuse/recycling collection along with winter maintenance operations. If you currently have one, please remove it from the street and place in on your property.

Watershed Protection Tip

Don't top off! “Topping off” a gas tank after the nozzle clicks can cost you money and pollute our streams! Overfilling causes gas spills that may drain to the storm sewer and nearby streams. And forcing extra gasoline into the tank can decrease engine efficiency and adversely affect the vehicle's emission system.

This Watershed Protection Tip is part of West Bradford Township's ongoing efforts to provide public education on stormwater management and the protection of our environment.

PREPARING FOR SNOWY WINTER ROADS 2019



To make the roads as safe as possible in winter, long hours in very tough conditions are spent by our Road Crew. Please cooperate with them and appreciate the fact that they are doing their best to serve the community. No matter how severe a snow or ice storm is, our staff is working to give you the best condition of roads as possible and as quickly. Our trucks salt, cinder, and plow over 125 lane miles of roads. We hire extra contractors and maintain stock piles of over 400 tons of anti-skid material. We stock extra parts for plows, salt spreaders, and truck chains. Despite our best efforts, we do have equipment breakdowns during snowstorms. This may delay work on certain routes. Please be patient. Each operator has a specific route that

includes high priority roads and lesser priority roads. Operators will cover their entire route with salt and anti-skid material. This helps to keep the snow and ice from freezing on the surface. After that they begin to plow their route. The intensity of the snowstorm determines how routes are completed. For minor storms, the entire route may be completed at once. However, if the storm intensifies, only priority routes (*usually through roads*) will be plowed. Cul-de-sacs and secondary roads will not be done until the main routes can be kept open. As the storm lightens, all roads will be opened. After all roads can be kept open, drivers complete their route by pushing snow back as far as possible on the cartway and clearing the intersections.

The Township does not plow private roadways, roadways not dedicated to the Township and most State-owned roadways. Bradford Avenue, Brandywine Drive, Glenside Road (from Beacon Hill Road into Downingtown), Camp Linden Road, Marshallton-Thorndale Road, Northbrook Road, Romansville Road, Downingtown Pike (Route 322), Embreeville Road, Stargazers Road, West Strasburg Road and Route 162 (from W. Strasburg to the Township line) are maintained by the Commonwealth. Please contact the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation at (610) 436-2091 to report snow removal concerns at these roadways. We thank you for continued patience and understanding while we work to keep our roads safe during the winter season. ✍️

Follow These Guidelines During a Snowstorm to Assist in Keeping the Roadways Open

- Don't park cars on a street during a snowstorm. Remove all vehicles from streets before the storm and keep them off until the streets are cleared. Having cars in the street not only delays the clearing of streets, but can result in the car owner receiving a fine and/or the car being towed.
- Wait until the roadway is cleared before shoveling your driveway, sidewalk and mailbox area. But if you must clear these areas sooner, please know Township trucks will likely throw snow back onto your property when plowing the road.
- Do not shovel snow into the roadway. Pushing snow from your driveway or sidewalk into the roadway creates a safety hazard and could cause an accident. Property owners may be held responsible for accident damages.
- Prepare your vehicle for winter driving. And if you are too nervous about driving on snow and ice, don't drive! Share a ride with a neighbor or wait until the roadways are cleared before traveling.
- Check your mailbox. We are not responsible for mailbox damage unless we actually hit the mailbox with a truck or plow blade. Heavy snow thrown from highway plows will break mailboxes and rotted posts and you are responsible for these repairs.

Do You Know?

ANSWER

Miss Anna Nields was the principal at the Marshallton Elementary School and was paid \$119.80 per month in 1936. In the same position, she received \$260.90 per month in 1952. She was fondly known by her students as Miss Anna. During the period of time that Miss Anna taught in Marshallton the township had its own school board to operate the elementary school and was not a part of the Downingtown Area School District.

Land Preservation and Sustainability Committee Update

Since West Bradford Township (WBT) residents approved the Open Space referendum in November 2018, 126.5 acres of open space have been approved for conservation by the LPSC and Township Supervisors, demonstrating that WBT landowners support the benefits of open space for their families and the community at large. We are grateful to the landowners who have committed their property to conservation and look forward to supporting many more landowners in doing the same. Many thanks to the participants and supporters of these events who helped make the events both fun and informative. Both events drew large crowds and gave WBT residents the opportunity to learn about the Broad Run, which runs entirely within WBT and is classified by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection as an exceptional value watershed. Exceptional value watersheds are rare and are designated as such because of their excellent water quality. High quality watersheds support healthy ecosystems, which may include endangered species such as bog turtles. Such is the case for the Broad Run. WBT residents can learn more about the Broad Run watershed and what they can do to help protect it by picking up a brochure in the township office. 🍃

The “Flushable Four”

If your property has a grinder pump, only four kinds of materials are permitted to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system:

- human waste and toilet paper
- food wastes processed through a garbage disposal unit (*but not grease*)
- water from sinks, tubs and dishwashers
- water from washing machines

All other materials can damage your grinder pump. This includes paint, adult wipes and baby wipes. Property owners are responsible for any damages caused by the discharge of prohibited materials.

Free Counseling from APPRISE During Medicare Annual Open Enrollment Period

Are you unhappy with your Medicare Advantage Plan or Part D Drug Plan? Are you thinking about making a change during this year’s Annual Open Enrollment Period (AOEP), but are unsure about the options available? APPRISE counselors are specially-trained volunteers who can assist you in evaluating your options so that you can determine which will give you the best value in 2020. APPRISE is a free, health insurance counseling program offered by the Chester County Department of Aging. The 2019 AOEP will run from October 15–December 7. **West Bradford Township will be hosting two days of APPRISE counseling at the township building on Monday, October 28 and Friday, November 15.** If you want to schedule a free, one-on-one, confidential meeting with a counselor, contact the Chester County Department of Aging at 610-344-5234. Tips for the Safe Use of Portable Generators

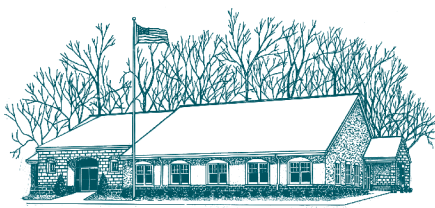
During long-term power outages many rely on portable generators for emergency power but many generators are installed and operated incorrectly and pose a real threat to the lives of family, neighbors and utility crews working to restore service.

FOLLOW THE TIPS BELOW WHEN INSTALLING AND OPERATING PORTABLE GENERATORS:



- To avoid electrocution, keep the generator dry. Do not use in rain or wet conditions. Operate it on a dry surface under an open canopy-like structure. Make sure your hands are dry before touching the generator.
 - Turn off all appliances and lights before you begin operating the generator. Once the generator is running, turn appliances and lights on one at a time to avoid overloading the unit. And don’t forget to use safety-tested, shop-type electrical cords designed and rated for heavier, outdoor use.
 - Never try to power house wiring by plugging the generator into a wall outlet. This practice, known as “back feeding”, can lead to the electrocution of utility workers or neighbors served by the same utility transformer. The only safe way to connect a generator to house wiring is to have a qualified electrician install a power transfer switch.
 - Shut down your generator correctly. Turn off and unplug all appliances and equipment being powered before shutting off the generator. Drain the gasoline from the generator while it is being stored, and inspect the fuel and oil filters, spark plug, oil level and fuel quality on a regular basis... and before the next power outage!
- Follow the directions supplied with the generator. Incorrect generator use can lead to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from the toxic engine exhaust, electric shock, electrocution and fire. Never use a portable generator indoors and never use a portable generator in a garage, carport, basement, crawl space or other enclosed or partially-enclosed area...even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent CO buildup in the home.
 - Generators should be at least 20 feet away from buildings. At even 20 feet away air flow patterns may still blow carbon monoxide into homes through attic vents, windows or doors. Keep the generator away from these openings and maintain a working carbon monoxide detector inside the home.
